

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Sixth day of February, 1812, and continued by several Prorogations to Thursday the Eighth day of February, 1816, in the Fifty-sixth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Sixth Session of the Tenth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. From Henry H. Cogswell, The Statutes at Large passed in the General Assembly held in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia: from the Sixth Session of the Eighth General Assembly, to the Fifty-Sixth year of his Majesty's Reign. 56 George III – Chapter 9

An Act to extend the Provisions of an Act to give power to the Firewards of the Town of Halifax, to prevent dangerous Quantities of Gunpowder being kept within the said Town and Harbour thereof, to the Town of Windsor.

Be it enacted, that the Act, passed in the fifty-fourth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, An Act to give power to the Firewards of the town of Halifax to prevent dangerous Quantities of Gunpowder being kept within the said town and Harbour, and all the provisions, and every matter and clause therein contained, be extended, and the same is hereby extended, to the town plot of Windsor, in the county of Hants, in the same manner as if the said town of Windsor, was specially named in the said Act.
