Anno sexagenno Georgii III.

At the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax on Thurfday, the Eleventh Day of February, 1819; and continued by several Prorogations until Thursday, the Tenth Day of February, 1820, in the Sixtieth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c &c. &c. being the Second Seffion of the Eleventh General Affembly, convened in the faid Province.*

CAP. I.

An ACT to revive, amend and continue, the feveral Acts of the General Affembly for granting to His Majefty certain duties on Wine, Brandy, Gin, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, Molasses, Coffee, and Brown Sugar, for the support of His Majesty's Government, and for promoting the Agriculture, Commerce and Fisheries, of the Province.

DE it enacted by the Governor, Council and Affembly, That the Act of the General Affembly, paffed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, An ACt for granting Act 55th Geo. to His Majesty certain Duties on Wine, Brandy, Gin, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, Molaffes, Coffee and Brown Sugar, for the support of His Majesty's Government, and for promoting the Agriculture, Commerce and Fisheries, of this Province ; and also the Act, made in the fifty-eighth year of His Majefty's Reign, entitled, An Act to continue and amend the feveral Acts of the General Aflembly, for granting to His Majefty certain Duties on Wihe, Brandy, Gin, Rum, and other diftilled Spirituous Liquors, Molaffes, [with excepti-Coffee and Brown Sugar, for the fupport of His Majesty's Government, and for promoting ons.] the Agriculture, Commerce and Filheries, of this Province, and every matter, clause, and thing

Duty reduced on Rum distilled in the Province.

Masters of Vessels arriving in any of the Ports of the Province, to report to the Collectors of Impost and Excise, on Oath.

Form of Oath.

Neglect of Masters. thirg, contained in the faid Acts, except fo far as the fame are hereby altered and amended, be revived and continued, and the fame are hereby revived and continued until the twenty-fifth day of March, which will be in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, and no longer.

II. And be it further enocled. That the Duty of ten pence per gallon, imposed on all Rum, and other Spirituous Liquors, diftilled within this Province, under the Act, passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Duties on Wine, Brandy, Gin, Rum, and other diftilled Spirituous Liquors, Molasses, Cossee, and Brown Sugar, for the support of His Majesty's Government, and for promoting the Agriculture, Commerce and Fisheries, of this Province, be reduced, and the fame is hereby reduced, to fix-pence per gallon, any thing in the faid Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

III. And be it further enacled, That the Mafter of every registered Veffel, thall, within twenty-four hours after the arrival of fuch Veffel into any Port, Harbour or Creek, within this Province, render an Account or Report in writing to the Collector of Impost and Excise for the District in which fuch Veffel thall arrive, of the Articles of Cargo laden on board of fuch Veffel at her last Port, and then on board the fame, and thall verify the faid Account or Report by the following Oath :

I. A. B. do folemnly fwear, that the Account or Report which I have now made and fubfcribed contains a true and juft account of all the articles of every defcription laden on board the called the at and that I have not landed or fuffered to be landed, fold, delivered, bartered, or exchanged, from, or out of the faid any articles whatever, at any port or place within this Province, or on the Coaft thereof, fince my failing from So help me God.

IV. CAP. II.
