the ways, means, rules, provisions and directions, and under the exemptions, regulations, forfeitures and penalties, expressed, prescribed and declared, in an Act, passed in the fiftyfitth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Duties on Wine, Brandy, Gin, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, Molafies, Coffee and Brown Sugar, for the support of His Majefty's Government, and for promoting the Agriculture, Commerce and Fisheries, of the Province,

III. And be it further enacted, That if any of the Goods, Wares, and Merchandife, upon which the additional Duties hereby imposed, shall be paid or fecured, shall be exported from the Province, under the limitations, regulations, and provisions of the Acts, by which Duties are already imposed and payable thereon, or under the regulations of the Act Drawback on relating to Drawbacks, passed in the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty's reign, that then the exporter shall be entitled to a Drawback of the additional Duties hereby imposed.

IV. And be it further enacted, That no fee or per certage whatfoever shall be allowed to, or retained by, the Collector of Impost and Excise for the District of Halifax, for receiving, collecting, and paying over, any monies to be raised by virtue of this Act.

V. And be it further enacted, That this Act, and every matter, and thing, herein contained, shall be and continue in full force and virtue, until the twenty-fifth day of March, which will be in the year of Our Lord one thouland eight hundred and twenty-one, and no longer.

CAP. XVIII.

An ACT to authorife the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being, to appoint Commissioners to lifue Treasury Notes, to an amount not exceeding Twenty

BE it enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor. Lieutenant Governor being, to appoint three fit and proper persons as Commissioners to Iffue Ireasury Notes, Appointment to any amount, not exceeding Twenty Thousand Pounds; the faid Notes so to be Islued, ers. shall be of two pound Notes, and one pound Notes, and shall bear date the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and twenty; and shall be of the same form, signed, counterfigned, and delivered, and shall be paid, and received in payment, in like manner, and again re-iffued, under the rules, regulations, reftrictions and provisions, as are mentioned, expressed, and contained, in the Act, passed in the fifty-third year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act to authorife the Treasurer of the Province to call in, and pay, the Treasury Notes, heretofore issued, and to empower the Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being, to appoint Commissioners to Isue Treasury Notes.

II. And be it further enacted, That the faid Commissioners, so to be appointed as aforefaid, before they enter upon the Duties imposed by this Act, shall respectively take and fubscribe, before any one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, the following Oath:

I, A. B. do iwear, that I will well and faithfully do and perform, what I am directed and empowered to do, as a Commissioner to Issue Treasury Notes, under an Act, entitled, An

C. XVIII.

An Act to authorife the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being to appoint Commissioners to Issue Treasury Notes ; and that I will not knowingly fign any more, or greater amount of Treasury Notes than I am authorised to do under the faid Act. So help me God : which Affidavit shall be filed in the Office of the Secretary of the Province.

Counterfeiting Notes III. And be it further enacted, That if any perfon or perfons whofoever, fhall counterfeit any of the Notes aforefaid, iffued by virtue of this Act, or alter any of the fame, fo that they fhall appear to be of greater value than when originally iffued, or fhall knowingly pafs, or give in payment, any of the Notes aforefaid, fo counterfeited or altered; every perfon, convicted thereof, fhall be fet in the Pillory for the fpace of one whole hour, and one of the ears of fuch offender fhall be nailed thereto, and fuch offender fhall be publicly whipped through the fireets of the town or place where fuch offence fhall have been committed, and fhall pay all charges of the profecution.

IV. And be it further enacted, That in cafe the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being, fhall, by his Warrant or Warrants, require the Treasurer of the Province, to re-iffue the Notes received in payment at the Treasury, or to require the Commissioners to iffue other Notes, in lieu of those so received, or any part thereof, it shall and may be lawful for the Treasurer to re-iffue the faid Notes, or the Commissioners to iffue other Notes, agreeably to the faid Warrants. Provided, the new Notes, so to be re-iffued, shall not exceed the amount of the Notes so from time to time received in payment at the Treasury.

V. And be it further enacted, That if, after the thirty-first day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, all the Treasury Notes, which shall be issued and re-issued, under, and in virtue of, this Act, shall not have been received in payment of Duties by the Collectors of Impost and Excise, and paid into the Treasury, it shall and may be lawful for the holders of any such Treasury Notes to present the same for payment at the Office of the Treasurer of the Province, and the Treasurer is hereby directed and required to pay all such Treasury Notes on demand in gold and filver.

VI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing hereincontained, shall extend, or be construed to extend, to authorife any issue or re-issue of Treasury Notes under this Act, or that may be issued or re-issued under any other Act heretofore made, so as to have in circulation at any one time a greater sum than Seventy Thousand Pounds.

VII. And be it further enacled, That if any perfon, at any quarterly period after the thirty-firft day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, that is to fay, at the thirty-firft day of March, the thirtieth day of June, the thirtieth day of September, and the thirty-firft day of December, in any fucceeding year, shall tender for payment, at the Treasury, any number of Treasury Notes, issued under, and in virtue of, this Act, or which have heretofore been issued, or re-issued, under and in virtue of the Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of His Majefty's Reign, entitled, An Act to empower the Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being, to appoint Commissioners to issue Treasfurer shall not be able to pay the fame in gold and filver, it shall and may be lawful, for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being, by and with the advice of His Majefty's Council, by Warrant, under his Hand and Seal, to direct the Commissioners aforesaid, to fund fuch fum or fums of money, in treasfury Notes, as shall be so tendered in payment, from time

time to time, as aforefaid, and to grant Certificates to the amount thereof on Interest, and the faid Commissioners shall, in presence of the faid Treasurer, cancel the faid Notes, by catting therefrom the name of the Treasurer, and the year in which they are iffued, and shall deliver the fame to the Secretary of the Province to be examined, and deftroyed, as by the seventh section of this Act is directed.

VIII. And be it further enacled, That it shall and may be lawful, for the Treasurer, and he is hereby directed, when and as foon as he fhall receive a fum of money, in gold and filver, sufficient to pay and discharge the amount, principal and interest, due upon any Certificate granted under this Act, he shall give fixty days Notice of his intention to pay fuch Certificate, and fix a day for the payment thereof; and as gold and filver shall be received into the Treasury, sufficient to pay the principal and interest, due upon any other Certificate or Certificates, granted as aforefaid, he shall give the same Notice, and shall continue to do fo, paying and discharging the smaller Certificates before the larger ones, until the whole of the principal and interest due upon the Certificates, granted as aforefaid, shall be fully paid and fatisfied ; and the perfon or perfons holding fach Certificate or Certificates, failing to attend and produce the fame at the times respectively limited, all future interest thereon shall cease, and no other or greater amount of Interest, shall be paid on fuch Certificates fo called in, than was due and payable at the time the fame were required to be prefented to the Treasury as aforefaid.

IX. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the faid Treasurer, and he is hereby directed, to pay to the perfon or perfons duly authorifed to receive the fame, yearly, and every year, the interest, as the same may become due, upon any Cer- Notes studed. tificate or Certificates granted under this Act, until the principal thereof shall be fully paid and discharged.
