poses, any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

DE it enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That an Act, passed in the sisty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign, for establishing a Bridewell or House of Correction for the County of Halifax, and for providing a Police Office in said Town, with proper Officers to attend the same; and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, shall be continued, and the same is hereby continued, for one year, and from thence to the end of the next Sessions of the General Assembly.
