

thirty days, to repair the same completely, then it shall be lawful for the said Inspectors to direct the said Toll Gates and Bars to be opened or removed; and to continue opened or removed until the said Company shall have completely repaired the said Road; and no Toll Rate or Imposition whatever shall be demanded by, or be payable to, the said Company, while the said Road shall remain unrepaired, nor until the said Inspectors shall permit the replacing and shutting the said Turnpike Gates or Bars.

XII. *And be it further enacted*, That in case a sufficient number of persons shall not have associated themselves together, and obtained a Charter for their Incorporation, agreeably to the Provisions contained in this Act, within the space of two years, to be computed from the end of the present Session of General Assembly, then, and in such case, this Act, and every matter and thing therein contained, shall be null and void, to all intents and purposes, any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

CAP. XXVII.

An ACT to continue an Act for establishing a Bridewell or House of Correction, for the County of Halifax, and for providing a Police Office in the said Town, with proper Officers to attend the same.

BE it enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That an Act, passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign, for establishing a Bridewell or House of Correction for the County of Halifax, and for providing a Police Office in said Town, with proper Officers to attend the same; and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, shall be continued, and the same is hereby continued, for one year, and from thence to the end of the next Sessions of the General Assembly.

CAP. XXVIII.

An ACT for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the Service of the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies granted in this Session of the General Assembly as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province.

May it please Your Excellency,

WE, His Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the House of Assembly of His Majesty's Province of Nova-Scotia, towards appropriating the Supplies granted to His Majesty in this Session of the General Assembly, and for supplying the exigencies of His Majesty's Government, do humbly beseech that it may be enacted, and,

I. *BE it enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly*, That, by or out of such Monies

as now are, or from time to time shall be and remain, in the Public Treasury of this Province, there shall be paid :—

WHEREAS

WHEREAS a vessel of the burthen of one hundred and forty-two tons, or thereabouts, owned by Abraham Cunard, and Samuel Cunard, has been fitted and cleared out, upon a Whaling Voyage South of the Equator, and it is reasonable that the owners should receive some encouragement for so laudable an undertaking:

III. *BE it therefore further enacted*, That, if the said Vessel shall carry on the Whale Fishery four months, and shall return to this Province, previous to the expiration of eighteen months, with a great quantity of Oil and Head Matter, taken together, not less in the whole than twenty tons, and being the produce of any Whale or Whales, or other Creatures being in the seas, and taken and killed by the Crew of such Ship or Vessel, the said Owners shall be allowed and paid the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds.

IV. *And be it further enacted*, That if any accident shall happen to any of the Bridges on the Main Roads in this Province, or if any unforeseen obstruction to travelling shall arise from the fall of trees, or otherwise, it shall and may be lawful for His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander-in-Chief, to order a Commissioner or Commissioners to re-build or repair such Bridges, or to remove such obstructions. And it shall be further lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, from time to time, to draw Warrants on account, and in favor of such Commissioner or Commissioners. *Provided* the same shall not exceed the sum of five hundred pounds.

V. *And be it further enacted*, That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being, to draw by Warrant on the Treasury, from time to time, for all such sums of Money as may become due and payable, by virtue of the several Laws now in force for the establishing of Schools in the Province.

Monies to be drawn by Warrant from the Treasury.

VI. *And be it further enacted*, That the ninth, twelfth, fifteenth, sixteenth, eighteenth and nineteenth sections or clauses of the Act, made and passed in the forty-first year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for applying certain Monies therein mentioned, for the service of the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies granted in this Session of the General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province," shall be, and continue, in full force and virtue until the twenty-fifth day of March, which will be in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, in as full and ample a manner as the same clauses would be, were the same again here repeated word for word.
