#### CAP. V.

An ACT to amend, revive, and continue, the feveral Acts imposing a Duty on Articles to be imported from the United States of America, and for appropriating the fame.

D E is enacled, by the Governor, Council, and Affembly, That the Act, paffed in the fiftyfifth year of His Majefly's Reign, entitled, An Act imposing a Duty on articles to be imported from the United States of America, and for appropriating the fame, (except the Seventh Section thereof); and also, the Act, made in the fifty-feventh year of His Majefty's Reign, to alter and continue the aforefaid Act, and every matter, claufe and thing, contained in the faid Acts, be revived and continued, and the same are hereby revived and continued, until the 25th d2y of March, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, and no longer.

And be it further enacled, That all Horfes, Oxen, Cows, Young Cattle, Sheep and Hogs, which shall be imported into this Province from the United States of America, or from Duties on Live any of the Islands in the Bay of Paffamaquoddy, shall be subject to the following Duties : For and upon every Horse, Mare or Gelding, two Pounds.

For and upon every Ox, one pound five shillings.

For and upon every Cow, and head of Young Cattle, ten shillings.

For and upon every Sheep, one shilling and three pence.

For and upon every Hog, five shillings.

Inftead of the Duty heretofore paid on articles fo imported, which Duties, hereby eftablifhed, shall be collected, paid and applied, in the same manner as mentioned, expressed, and contained, in the Act of which this is an amendment.

## CAP. VI.

An ACT to impose a Duty on Articles Sold at Public Auction. D E it enacted, by the Governor, Council and Affembly, That all Goods, Chattels, Wares, Merchandife, and Effects whatfoever, which shall or may hereafter be fold at Public Auction, Vendue or Outcry, within this Province, by any Auctioneer or Auctioneers, or by any other perfon or perfons whatfoever, shall be, and are hereby made subject to a Duty of two pounds ten shillings, for every hundred pounds of the value or price at which the fame shall be fold as aforefaid, and to the same rate for every greater or leffer sum, to be paid by the perfon or perfons who shall fell the fame as aforefaid. Provided always, that all Goods belonging to the Crown, or feized by any Public Officer or Officers, for, or on account of any forfeiture or forfeitures, penalty or penalties, Horles, Castle, Langs, Ships and Vessels, Goods and Effects of deceased persons, Goods distrained for rent or taken in Execution, Effects of Infolvent Debtors, Houshold Furniture, not imported into this Province for fale, Goods damaged at Sea, and fold on account of the Owners and Infurers within twenty-one days after the fame shall be landed, and Salt, shall not be subject to, and are hereby declared free from, the Duty before-mentioned.

II. And be it further enacted, That no Auctioneer or Auctioneers, or other perfon or persons whatever, shall sell or dispose of any Goods, Chattels, Wares, Merchandise, or Effects whatfoever, on which the Duty is imposed by this Act, at Public Auction, Vendue or Outcry, without having previously obtained a License for that purpose from His Excellency

lency the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time being, and having given fecurity by Bond to our Sovereign Lord the King, his Heirs and Succeffors, in the fom of four hundred pounds, with two fufficient fureties, each in the fum of two hundred pounds, conditioned for the payment of the Duties hereinbefore-mentioned, by any such Auctioneer or Auctioneers, within the Town or Diftrict of Halifax, to the Treasurer of the Province, and by any such Auctioneer or Auctioneers in any other District or County within the Province, to the Collector of Impost and Excile for the District or County in which such Auctioneer or Auctioneers shall refile, or be appointed to, and in all things well and truly to comply with the Provisions of this Act; which Bond shall be filed with the Secretary of the Province.

III. And be it further enacted, That if any perfon or perfons shall vend, or offer to vend, at Public Auction, or Outcry, any Goods, Chattels, Wares, Merchandife or Effects, which, by this Act, are made liable to the payment of the Duty aforefaid, without having obtained a License, and given Bond as aforesaid, he or they shall forfeit and pay for each offenc e the fum of fifty pounds.

IV. And be it further enacted, That each and every Auctioneer or Auctioneers, or other person or persons, who shall at any time or times, during the continuance of this Act, either for himself or themselves, or on his or their own account, or on account of any other person or persons whomsoever, sell or dispose of any Goods, Chattels, Wares, Merchandile, or Effects, liable to the Duty imposed by this Act, at Public Auction, Vendue or Outcry, fhall, at or within twenty-one days after the expiration of every three months from the commencement of this Act, render a just, exact, and true account in writing, figued by the perfon or perfons fo felling, within the Town or Diffrict of Halifax, on Oath, to the terly. Treasurer aforesaid, and by the person or persons so selling, in any other District or County, on Oath, to the Collector of Impost and Excise, for the District or County in which such Auctioneer or Auctioneers shall refide, or be appointed to, of all and fingular the Goods, Chattels, Wares, Merchandife and Effects, with the amount thereof, which he or they shall have so fold, and disposed of, at Public Auction, Vendue or Outcry at each fale as aforefaid ; and shall in such account state the whole quantity of each article fold, whether by fample or otherwife ; and fhall, within twenty-one days after the expiration of every three months as aforefaid, pay, if in the Town or District of Halifax, to the Treasurer of the Province, or, if in any other Diffrict or County, to the Collector of Impost and Excise of the faid District or County, the faid Duty of two pounds ten shillings, out of every hundred pounds value for every fuch respective fale, and at and after the fame rate for a greater or leffer value ; which Oath shall be in the following words :---

I, A. B. do folemnly fwear, in the prefence of Almighty God, that the account exhibit- Auctioneer's ed by me, and to which I have subscribed my name, contains a just and true statement of all the Goods, Wares, Merchandife, and Effects, fold by me, or any perfon or perfons under me, whether by fample, or otherwife, which are liable to the Duty imposed by an Act, entirled, An Act to impose a Duty on Articles Sold at Public Auction. So help me God,

V. And be it further enacled, That if fuch Auctioneer or Auctioneers, perfon or perfons, shall refuse or neglect to deliver such account upon Oath, as aforesaid, and to pay the Auctioneers fhall refuse or neglect to deliver iuch account upon Gath, as altricially, and to pay the neglecting to Duty herein imposed, within the time limited as aforesaid, he or they so refufing and neg. neglecting to account quarlecting shall respectively forfeit and pay for each and every offence, the fum of fifty terly. pounds, and shall also pay the Duty imposed upon such Sales, as if no penalty had been imposed

VI. And be it further enacted, That all penalties imposed by this Act, shall be recovered by Bill, Plaint or Information, in any Court of Record, within this Province, one half thereof to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, for the use of this Province, the other half thereof to the perfon who shall fue for the fame.

VII. And be it further enacted, That all monies raifed under this Act, shall be paid into the Treasury, and placed to the general credit of this Province.

VIII. And be it further enabled, That this Act, and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, shall continue, and the same is hereby continued, in full force and effect, until the eighteenth day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, and no longer.

### CAP. VII.

An ACT in amendment of an Act, passed in the second year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for appointing Firewards, afcertaning their Duty, and for punishing Thefts and Disorders at the time of Fire.

Preamble.

X 7 HEREAS, since the passing of the said Act, many Houses and Buildings of stone and brick have been erected in the Town of Hulifax, by which the danger of Fire has been diminished; and, in case

of Fire, such Houses and Buildings are a great means of the preventing the spreading thereof, and it is

expedient to encourage the creetion of such Houses and Buildings :

I. BE it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That when any Fire shall break cut in the faid Town of Halifax, or the Suburbs thereof, and any Building or Buildings shall, under the authority prescribed by Law, be pulled down, for the stopping and preventing the further spreading of the faid Fire, that no Houses or Buildings of stone or brick, covered with tile, flate, tin or theet iron, hereafter to be built, thall be subjected to be affefied for more than one fourth part of the value thereof, for the purpole of : paying the Owner or Owners of fuch Building or Buildings as may have been pulled down, to prevent the fpreading of any fuch Fire; any Law, ulage or cuftom to the contrary notwichstanding.

II. And be it further enacled, That all ftone and brick Buildings, covered with fhingles or any other combustible materials, shall be liable to an affessment upon one half part of the value thereof.

And whereas, it is expedient to encourage the formation of a greater number of Fire Engine Companies :

III. BE it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Court of General Quarter Seffions of the Peace, to be held in Halifax, to appoint a further number, not exceeding twenty discreet and prudent perions, as Engine Men, in addition to the number appointed under the authority of any former Statutes, and fuch perfons, fo appointed, shall be fubjest to the duties, and entitled to all the privileges and exemptions, imposed and granted, by the faid Statutes, to Fire-Engine Meo.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the Act of the General Affembly, paffed in the fiftyfecond year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act in addition to an Act, made in the fecond year of His prefent Majetty's Reign, entitled, 'An' Act for appointing Firewards, alcertaining
