At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Eleventh day of February, 1819, in the Fifty-Ninth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the First Session of the Eleventh General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

59 George III – Chapter 26

An Act to revive, continue and amend, an Act to provide for the support of a Light-House at the South end of Coffin's Island, on the Eastern side of the entrance of Liverpool Harbour.

Whereas, the said act hath expired, and it is expedient to revie the same:—

- I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and assembly, that, an act, passed in the fifty-second year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act to provide for the support of a Light-House on the South end of Coffin's Island, on the Eastern side of the entrance of Liverpool Harbour," and every matter, clause and thing, therein mentioned, be revived, and the same is hereby revived.
- II. And be it further enacted, that no ship or vessel coming from a foreign port, or engaged on a costing voyage, shall be liable to pay light duty more than once upon any such voyage; but if the said duty shall be demanded the second time, the master of the said vessel shall produce to the person demanding the same, the certificate of his having previously paid the light duty upon the same voyage.

And whereas, a light-house has been recently erected on Cranberry Island near Canso Harbour, which will be highly beneficial to vessels sailing to and from the eastern parts of the province:

- III. Be it therefore enacted, that all vessels entering into any port or ports to the eastwards, where His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor may think proper to appoint collectors of light-money, shall be subject and liable to the same rates and duties as are paid by vessels entering into the harbour of Halifax.
- IV. And be it further enacted, that the said act hereby revived, together with this act, shall be, and the same is hereby, continued in force for one year from the publication hereof, and from thence to the end of the next session of the General Assembly.
