At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday the Eleventh day of February, 1819; and continued by several Prorogations until Thursday, the Tenth day of February, 1820, in the Sixtieth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Second Session of the Eleventh General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

60 George III – Chapter 27

An Act to continue an Act for establishing a Bridewell or House of Correction, for the County of Halifax, and for providing a Police Office in the said Town, with proper Officers to attend the same.

Be it enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, that an act, passed in the fifty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign, for establishing a bridewell or house of correction for the county of Halifax, and for providing a police office in said town, with proper officers to attend the same; and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, shall be continued, and the same is hereby continued, for one year, and from thence to the end of the next sessions of the general assembly.
