1 & 2 George IV – Chapter 19

An Act to make perpetual an Act for the Security of Navigation, and for preserving all Ships, Vessels and Goods, which may be found on Shore, wrecked or stranded, upon the Coasts of this Province; and for punishing Persons who shall steal Shipwrecked Goods, and for the relief of Persons suffering loss thereby.

Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that an act, passed in the forty-first year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for the security of Navigation, and for preserving all Ships, Vessels and Goods, which may be found on shore, wrecked or stranded, upon the coasts of this Province, and for punishing persons who shall steal shipwrecked goods, and for the relief of persons suffering loss thereby," and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, except the tenth and eleventh sections of the said act, shall be, and the same is hereby, made perpetual.
