

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of December, 1820, in the First year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. and ended on the Third Day of March, in the Second Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, being the First Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. 1 & 2 George IV – Chapter 21

An Act to extend part of an Act, passed in the fiftieth year of His late Majesty's Reign, in amendment of an Act relating to the repairing and paving the Streets in the Town of Halifax, to the Towns of Annapolis and Digby.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the first clause of the act, passed in the fiftieth year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act in addition to and in amendment of an Act, passed in the forty-first year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for repairing, cleansing and paving, the Streets in the Town and Peninsula of Halifax, and for removing obstructions therein;'" and also, the act in amendment thereof, passed in the forty-second year of His present Majesty's reign, and every part of the said clause, be extended, and the same is hereby extended, to the towns of Annapolis and Digby.
