

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of December, 1820, in the First year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. and ended on the Third Day of March, in the Second Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, being the First Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province. From William Hill & W. B. Bliss, The Statutes at Large, passed in the General Assemblies held in His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia: from the Year 1817, to the year 1826, inclusive (vol. 3). 1 & 2 George IV – Chapter 7

An Act to make perpetual an Act in addition to an Act for regulating the Common belonging to the Township of Lunenburg.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that an act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled, "An act for regulating the Common belonging to the Township of Lunenburg" and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, shall be, and the same is hereby, made perpetual.
