. II. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the faid Justices, in their General Seffions, from time to time, and at all times hereafter, to nominate and appoint Keepers of faid Market-Houles, respectively, who shall be sworn to the faithful discharge of his or their office, and (hall have the fame power and authority as a Conftable, in all matters relating to keeping peace and order in the faid Markets; and the faid Juffices may, from time to time, at their pleafure, remove fuch Keeper or Keepers, and appoint another in his room, and shall regulate and fix the rate or rates of the stalls or standings in faid Markets, and shall have full power and authority to make and publish fuch bye-laws from time to time as may be neceffary for the better regulating, ruling, governing, and ordering, faid Market or Markets when established, Provided the fame be not repugnant to the Laws of Great-Britain or of this Province; and it shall be lawful for the faid Inflices to enforce obedience to fuch bye-laws, by imposing a fine, not-exceeding the fum of ten shillings, for each and every offence ; and upon due conviction of any offender against fuch bye-laws, before any one of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace, for the faid County. it shall be lawful for fuch Juffice to cause such fine to be levied by Warrant of Diffress, and sale of the offender's goods and chattels.

III. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful, for the Grand Jury of the feveral Districts in the faid County, from time to time, to raife, by prefertment in the usual form, fo much money as may be necessary to build, repair, and erect, the faid Market Houses; and the rent of the stalls and standings in faid Markets, together with all fines and forfeitures, arising in pursuance of this AO, shall be applied to the keeping of faid Market-Houses, respectively, in repair, and to no other use.

CAP. XHI.

An ACT for altering, the time of holding the Courts of Common Pleas and General Seffions, of, the Peace in the County of Cumberland.

WHEREAS the holding the Courts of Common Pleas and General Sessions of the Peace on the Preamble second Tuesday of April, and the last Fuesday of October, in the County of Cumberland, hath been

found inconvenient, for remedy whereof:

I. BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, That the faid Courts of Common Pleas and General Seffions of the Peace, shall, in future, be held in the Township of Amherst, in the County of Cumberland, on the last Tuesday of April and the first Tuesday of November, any law, usage or custom, to the contrary notwithstanding.

II. And be it further enacted, I hat all inch Writs, as may have been, or shall be, issued, returnable to the faid Court, on the fecond Tuesday of April, shall, instead thereof, be returnable on the last Tuesday of April; and all Writs, hereafter to be issued, shall be made returnable on the last Tuesday of April, and the fecond Tuesday of November, the day of the fitting of the faid Courts, and the parties shall be bound to appear in faid Courts accordingly.
