

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday, the Fourteenth Day of February, 1822, in the Third year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. and ended on the Third Day of March, in the Second Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, being the First Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

3 George IV – Chapter 10

An Act to continue an Act, for granting a Drawback of the Duties on Brown or Raw Sugar, used in the Manufacture of Refined Sugar within the Province, and for regulating the mode of obtaining the same.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the act, passed in the fifty-seventh year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for granting a Drawback of the Duties on Brown or Raw Sugar, used in the Manufacture of refined Sugar within the Province, and for regulating the mode of obtaining the same," be continued, and the same, with every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, is hereby continued until the twenty-fifth day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three, and no longer.
