At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday, the Fourteenth Day of February, 1822, in the Third year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. and ended on the Third Day of March, in the Second Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, being the First Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

3 George IV – Chapter 14

An Act to continue an Act for establishing a Bridewell, or House of Correction, for the County of Halifax, and for providing a Police Office in said Town, with proper Officers to attend the same.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that an act, passed in the fifty-fifth year of His late Majesty's reign, for establishing a Bridewell or House of Correction, for the county of Halifax, and for providing a police office in said town, with proper officers to attend the same, and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, be continued, and the same is hereby continued for one year, and from thence to the end of the next session of the general assembly.
