

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday, the Fourteenth Day of February, 1822, in the Third year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. and ended on the Third Day of March, in the Second Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, being the First Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

3 George IV – Chapter 2

An Act to amend and continue an Act, for raising an additional Duty of Excise on all Goods, Wares and Merchandise, imported into this Province.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the act, passed in the sixtieth year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for raising an additional Duty of Excise on all Goods, Wares and Merchandise, imported into this Province;" and every matter, clause and thing, in the said act contained, except so far as the same is hereby altered and amended, shall be continued, and the same is hereby continued, until the twenty-fifth day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-three, and no longer.

II. And be it further enacted, that it shall not be lawful, hereafter, for the commissioners of the revenue, or the treasurer, to grant any certificate for drawback of duties under, and by virtue of, the act of which this is in amendment, unless the sterling cost of the goods exported shall exceed the sum of one hundred pounds: any law, usage or custom, to the contrary thereof, in any wise notwithstanding.
