

*At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday, the Fourteenth Day of February, 1822, in the Third year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. and ended on the Third Day of March, in the Second Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, being the First Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.*

3 George IV – Chapter 4

**An Act to extend several Acts relating to Firewards, to the Town of Yarmouth.**

Whereas the increase of the town of Yarmouth makes it necessary, that Firewards should be appointed there, and proper precautions taken to preserve the said town from the danger of fire:

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that, from and after the publication hereof, an act, passed in the second year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, entitled, “An Act for appointing Firewards, ascertaining their duty, and for punishing thefts and disorders at the time of Fire;” and also, an act, made and passed in the fifty-second year of His said Majesty’s reign, in addition to the above recited act; and the several clauses, matters and things, in the said acts contained, shall be, and the same are hereby, extended to the said town of Yarmouth; and the justices in their sessions for the district of Yarmouth and Argyle, in the county of Shelburne, justices of the peace, and other persons whatsoever, in and within the said town of Yarmouth, are hereby bound strictly to conform to the said acts, and to carry the same into execution within the said town, in as full and ample a manner, to all intents and purposes, as if the said town of Yarmouth had been originally named therein.
