CAP. XXX.

An ACT to amend and continue the feveral Acts, now in force, for regulating the Expenditure of Monies for the fervice of Roads and Bridges.

E it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That an Act, paffed in Acts 524, 6714 the fifty-fecond year of His late Majefty's Reign, entitled, An AA to regulate and 60th Geo. the expenditure of Monies, hereafter to be appropriated for the tervice of Roads and (with excepti-Bridges, (except fo far as the faid Act is altered by the Acts hereinafter named); alfo ons) an Act, palsed in the fifty-leventh year of His late Majelty's reign, to alter and amend the faid Act, (except to far as the faid last mentioned Act is altered by the Act hereinafter named) and allo an Act, passed in the sixtieth year of His late Majesty's reign, to alter and continue the said Acts ; and every matter, claufe and thing, in the faid Acts contained, excepting as before excepted, shall be continued, and the fame are hereby continued, for one year, and from thence to the end of the next Sellion of the General Affembly,

AND WHERRAS, the Main Roads are often greatly injured by the locking or obsining the wheels

of loaded Waggons and Carts in descending the Hills ;

IL. Be it therefore exacted, That, from and after the publication hereof, it fhall not be Waggons, set lawful for the Driver of any loaded Waggon or Gart to cause fuch Waggon or Cart to chains, to have bedrawn upon any of the Public Roads of this Province, with any one or more of the iron and wood-Wheels of fuch Waggon or Cart locked or chained, to prevent it from surning, unless ed to the Such Driver of fuch Waggon or Cart shall caufe to be placed under fuch Wheel or Wheels Wheels an Iron Shoe, not loss than five inches in width, and fixteen inches in length, or a Wooden Shoe, of the fame length, and eight inches wide, connected with a chain to fome part of fuch Waggon or Cart, in fuch way that fuch Wheels or Wheels, fo chained or locked, that be borac up, and drawn, upon faid Shoe,

HI. And be it further enacted, That any Perfor who fhall drive any Waggon or Cart. on any of the faid Roads, contrary to the provisions of this Act, or who fhall place and leave on any of the faid Roads, any flones, flicks or other obfructions, fhall be fubject to a fine of Ten Shillings : to be recovered on the Oath of one credible Witnefs, before any one of His Majefly's Juff ces of the Peace for the County or Town wherein the offence final have been committed ; which sum, if not paid, fhall be levied by Warrant from fuch Juffice of the Peace, from off the Goods and Chattles of the offender, and for want thereof he fhall be committed to the jail of fuch County, for the space of twentyfour hours : and that all monies arifing from fines, under the provisions of this Act, fhall be applied for the repair of the Roads in the County wherein the fame fhall be received.
