And be it further enacted, That a fum of One Hundred and Fifty Pounds, grant- 1501, Bridge at ed in the year one:thouland eight hundred and twenty-one, for the purpole of crecting a Argyle Bridge over the Narrows at Argyle, in the County of Shelburne, and remaining undrawn from the Treasury, shall be applied and expended agreeable to the Refolution paffed in the House of Affembly on the Ninth day of March in the present year, and -agreed to by His Majefty's Council.

XV. And be it further enacted, That the fum of Ten Shillings per Day be allowed and Allowance to paid to the Members of the House of Affembly for their attendance in General Affem. Members of Assembly bly, upon the certificate of the Speaker of the House of Assembly.

XVI. And be it further enacted, That if any accident shall happen to any of the Bridges on Road Emera the Main Roads in this Province, or any unforeseen obstructions to travelling shall arise gencies from the fall of trees, or otherwife, it shall and may be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being, to order a Commissioner or Commissioners to repair or rebuild fuch Bridges, or . remove fuch obstructions ; and it shall and may be further lawful for the Governor, Lie, mant-Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, to draw warrants on accord, and in favor, of fuch Commissioner or Commissioners, provided the fame shall no. vceed the fum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Pou.

XVII. And be it further enacted, 'That the ninth, twelfth, fifteenth, fixteenth, eighteenth 9th, 12th, 15th, and nineteenth, festions or claufes of the Act. made and paffed in the forty-first year of 16th, 18th, and 19th Sections His late Majefty's reigo, entitled, An Act for applying certain Monies therein mention- Act 41st Geo.

ed, for the fervice of the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies, granted in this Seffion of the General Affembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province, Chall be and continue in full force and virtue until the twenty-fifth day of March, which will be in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, in as full and ample a manner as the fame claufes would be were they again repeated word for word.

### CAP. III.

#### An ACT to authorife the Incorporation of a Company for making a Canal by the River and Lakes of the Shubenaccadie.

Incorporation of DE it enacled by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That whenever a fuf-Shubenaccadie ficient number of Persons shall have affociated themselves together, for opening Canal Compa-: , and making a Navigable Cut Canal, or Water Communication, between the Harbour of Halifax and the Bason of Minas, by, along, or near to, the course of the River Shubenaccadie, and the Lakes thereof, and shall have agreed to raise sufficient Monies to effect the fame, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, at any time within five years from the pasfing hereof, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of this Province, to make, erect, and incorporate, all and fingular the Perfons who, from time to time, shall be adventurers in, or parties to, the faid undertaking, and their affigus, into one Body Politic and Corporate, in Deed and in Name, under the Title of-The Shubenaccadie Canal Company, and, by that name to have fucceffion, to fue and to be fued, to have a common Seal, and to poffess and enjoy fuch Powers with respect to the choice of a Prefident and other Officers, making Bye Laws, and regulating the affairs of the faid Company, as shall be expressed in the same Letters Patent.

> H. And be it further enacted, That the said Company, when fo Incorporated, shall, and they are hereby declared and made capable in Law, to have, hold, purchafe, receive, poffess, enjoy, and retain, lands, rents, and tenements, to the amount of Fifty Thouland Pounds, and no more at one time ; and allo, monies. goods, chattles and effects, to the amount of Twenty-five Thouland Pounds, and no more, at any one time; and also, to fell, grant, demife, alien, or otherwise dispose of, such lands, tenements, rents, monies, goods, chattles, and effects, at their free will and pleafure.

III. And be it further enacted, That in fuch Letters Patent, the neceffary Officers of named in Let- fuch Corporation, shall be named and defignated, and proper Perfons appointed to be such Officers for the first year; and that the faid Corporation may make, establish, and put in execution, fuch laws and regulations as may be neceffary for making fuch Canal and the works thereof, levying the afferiments, and for the government of the faid Corporation, provided, the fame shall in no case be repugnant to the Laws of this Province.
