

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday, the Thirteenth Day of February, 1823, in the Fourth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Third Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

4 George IV – Chapter 16

An Act to continue an Act for granting a Drawback of the Duties on Brown or Raw Sugar, used in the Manufacture of Refined Sugar within the Province, and for regulating the mode of obtaining the same.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, that the act, passed in fifty-seventh year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for granting a Drawback of the Duties on Brown or Raw Sugar, used in the Manufacture of Refined Sugar within the Province, and for regulating the mode of obtaining the same," be continued, and the same, with every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, is hereby continued until the twenty-fifth day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, and no longer.
