

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday, the Eighth day of January, 1824, in the Fourth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Fourth Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

4 George IV – Chapter 10

An Act to repeal several Acts of the General Assembly, passed to prevent forestalling, regrating and monopolizing.

Whereas the several acts hereinafter recited have been found ineffectual and injurious in their operation:

I. Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the act, passed in the thirty-second year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Second, entitled, “An Act to prevent forestalling the Market;” and also, the act passed, in the sixth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, entitled, “An Act against Forestallers and Regrators,” and every matter, clause and thing, in the said acts contained, be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

II. And be it further enacted, that this act shall be in force for one year, and from thence to the end of the next session of the general assembly.
