CAP. XXI.

An ACT to authorise the Incorporation of a Company for erecting a Bridge across Cornwallis River.

Preamble

WHEREAS, the Bridge lately built across the Cornu allis River, between the Townships of Cornwallis and Horton, in King's County, at the Fords of the said River, a short distance above the Townplot of Cornwallis, hath been carried away and destroyed by the floods and currents of the said River: And whereas, the erection of a substantial Bridge across the said River will be of great advantage to the Inhabitants of the said Township, and it is therefore expedient to encourage, by corporate privileges, such Persons as are willing to engage in such undertaking.
