V. And be it further enacted, That the faid Bridge, fo to be erected or renewed, and continued for Fifty all the piers, abutments, approaches, outlets, entrances and apputtenances thereof, and all lands or other property, purchased or obtained for the faid Bridge, or as appurtenant thereto, shall be, and the fame are hereby vested in, and declaved and made the fole and exclusive property of, the faid Company, for and during the term of fifty years from the date of the faid Letters Patent.

Toll or Pass Money

VI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That a way and paffage in, upon and over, the faid Bridge, and the approaches, outlets and entrances, thereof, shall be at all convenient times and feafons free and open to all His Majefty's Subjects, with their Cattle and Carriages, upon payment or tender of fuch reasonable Toll or Pass-money, as shall from time to time be fixed and allowed therefor by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, by and with the advice and confent of His Majefty's And provided a'ways, That His Majefty's Troops or embodied Militia, with Council. their Munitions of War and Baggage, on their march, shall always be exempt from fuch Toll.

VII. And be it further enacted, That the piers, abutments, covering timber and materials, now remaining of the Bridge lately erected over the faid River, and deftroyed as aforefaid, shall be, and the same are hereby declared to be, affigued to, and vested in, the faid Company, upon the iffuing of the faid Letters Patent, as and for their own property.

VIII. Privided always, and be it lastly enacted, That the faid intended Bridge shall be crected, and completed, within Five Years from the date of the faid Letters Patent; and be kept and maintained at all times in good and fufficient repair, during the continuance of the Toll hereby authorifed to be levied.

## CAP. XXII.

An ACT to prevent the cruel treatment of Horfes, Sheep or other Cattle, by Perfons owning or having the charge of the fame.

) E it enacted by the President, Council and Assembly, That if any Person or Persons owning or having the charge of any Hortes, Sheep or other Cattle, shall wantonly and cruelly maim, wound, or otherwife hurt any fuch Hortes, Sheep or other Cattle, fuch Person or Persons shall, upon conviction, before any one Magistrate, by any one or more witnefses, forfeit for each and every offence a lum not exceeding Three Pounds, nor lefs than Five Shillings, and, on non-payment thereof, be committed to the Gaol or House of Correction, for a time not exceeding twenty days, at the discretion of the Magistrate.

II. And be it further enacted, That the fum forfeited shall be paid, one half to the Profecutor, and the other half for the use of the Poor of the Patish in which the offence may be committed,
