

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuesday, the Fifteenth day of February, 1825, in the Sixth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Fifth Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

6 George IV – Chapter 10

An Act to continue and amend an Act, entitled, “An Act for the Summary Trial of Actions.”

Be it enacted by the President, Council and Assembly, that the act, passed in the third year of His present Majesty’s reign, entitled, “An Act for the Summary Trial of Actions,” which has been continued, by a subsequent act, to the end of the present session of the general assembly; and every matter, clause and thing, in the said act contained, shall be further continued, and the same is hereby continued, for one year, and from thence to the end of the next session of the general assembly. Provided always, that nothing contained in the act, hereby continued, shall extend or be construed to extend to permit the trial of any action, in a summary way, which may involve the title to land.
