

At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuesday, the Fifteenth day of February, 1825, in the Sixth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Fifth Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

6 George IV – Chapter 23

An Act relating to the Terms of the Supreme Court at Halifax.

Be it enacted by the President, Council and Assembly, that, from and after the passing of this act, the grand and petit jurors, who, by law, are required to attend the said supreme court, shall not be bound to give their attendance thereon during the trinity term, in every year, unless such jurors shall be specially summoned therefor under the order of some one of the judges for the issuing writs of venire fascias, returnable during the said trinity term.
