prevent Disorderly Riding, and to regulate the Driving of Carriages on the Streets of Halifax, or other Towns, or on the Public Roads of this Province, and for repealing certain Acts therein mentioned, and every matter, clause and thing, in the said Act contained, be continued, and the same are hereby continued, for five years, and from thence to the end of the next Session of the General Assembly.

CAP. XXXII.

An Act to repeal the last Clause of the Act to prevent the circulation of base and counterfeit Halfpence, and other Copper Coin, and to establish the current value of English Crowns, Half Crowns and Shillings, in this Province.

Preamble

THEREAS, it is found expedient to repeal so much of the said Act as fixes at a certain standard, the current value of the English Crown-piece, and the several proportions thereof, so that in future such Coin may pass current in this Province, according to the actual value—

I. Be it therefore enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, That Act 28th Geo. III. the last Section of the Act, passed in the twenty-eighth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, entitled, An Act to prevent the circulation of base and counterfeit Halfpence, and other Copper Coin, and to establish the current value of English Crowns, Half Crowns and Shillings, in this Province, and every matter and thing, in the said Clause contained, shall be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

CAP. XXXIII.

An Act to continue an Act, in addition to an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, entitled, An Act for regulating the rates and prices of Carriages.

Act 50th Geo III. continued

BE it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, That an Act, passed in the fiftieth year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled, An Act in addition to an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, entitled, An Act for regulating the rates and prices of Carriages, and every matter, clause and thing, therein contained, be continued, and the same are hereby continued, for five years, and from thence to the end of the next Session of the General Assembly.
