

*At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Wednesday, the First day of February, 1826, in the Seventh year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Sixth Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.*

7 George IV – Chapter 21

**An Act to continue an Act, entitled, “An Act more effectually to secure the payment of the Provincial Duties of Excise, and to prevent Frauds in the collection of the Provincial Revenue.”**

Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the act, made and passed in the third year of His present Majesty’s reign, entitled, “An Act more effectually to secure the payment of the Provincial Duties of Excise, and to prevent Frauds in the collection of the Provincial Revenue,” and every matter, clause, and thing, in the said act contained, shall be contained, and the same are hereby continued, until the twenty-fifth day of March, which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven.

II. And be it further enacted, that all the provisions and regulations of the said act, shall, so far as they may or can be applicable thereto, extend unto, and be applied to, all articles whatsoever, which, by force or virtue of any acts of the present session of the General Assembly, shall be made chargeable with any duties, or be declared entitled to any drawback of duties whatsoever.
