At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Wednesday, the First day of February, 1826, in the Seventh year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Sixth Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

7 George IV – Chapter 27

An Act to suspend the operation of the Acts to prevent forestalling, regrating and monopolizing, of Cord Wood, in the Town of Halifax.

Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that an act, passed in the eighteenth year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act to prevent forestalling, regrating, and monopolizing, of Cord Wood, in the Town of Halifax;" and also, the several acts, passed in by the general assembly, to amend the said act, and to continue the said amending acts, and every matter, clause and thing, in the said acts contained, shall be, and the same are hereby suspended, for the term of five years, from the passing of this act.

II. And be it also enacted, that this act shall be in force for five years, and no longer.
