

*At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Wednesday, the First day of February, 1826, in the Seventh year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the Sixth Session of the Twelfth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.*

7 George IV – Chapter 32

**An Act to repeal the last Clause of the Act to prevent the circulation of base and counterfeit Halfpence, and other Copper Coin, and to establish the current value of English Crowns, Half Crowns and Shillings, in this Province.**

Whereas, it is found expedient to repeal so much of the said act as fixes at a certain standard, the current value of the English crown-piece, and the several proportions thereof, so that in future such coin may pass current in this province, according to the actual value –

I. Be it therefore enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that the last section of the act, passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, entitled, “An Act to prevent the circulation of base and counterfeit Halfpence, and other Copper Coin, and to establish the current value of English Crowns, Half Crowns and Shillings, in this Province,” and every matter and thing, in the said clause contained, shall be, and the same are hereby, repealed.
