At the General Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday, First day of February, 1827, in the Eighth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith &c. &c. being the First Session of the Thirteenth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

8 George IV - Chapter 24

An Act to alter an Act, passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act concerning Schools."

Whereas, much inconvenience is experienced from the establishment of but one board of commissioners, under the eighth section of the act, passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act concerning Schools," in those counties of the province which are divided into separate and distinct districts, for remedy whereof:

- I. Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, that it shall and may be lawful for his Excellency the Governor, from time to time, as may be deemed expedient, to name and commission in each and every district of such counties of the province, as are, or may be sub-divided, into distinct and separate districts, three persons residing within such districts respectively, to form a board of commissioners for the inspection and general superintendance of schools, established, or to be established, within such districts, under the act of which this is an alteration, and that such commissioners shall, in all things, be guided by the enactments and provisions of the said act.
- II. And be it further enacted, that His Excellency the Governor shall and may, as circumstances may require, and as to him may seem proper, divide to and among the several districts of such counties respectively, as are herein-before referred to, any sum of money, which, under the twenty-first section of the said act, of which this is an alteration, may be allowed an paid for the use of schools in each and every such county.
- III. And be it further enacted, that this act shall continue and be in force for two years, and from thence to the end of the next session of the general assembly.
