Mereas the Erecting or Setting of Bedges. Wears. Fishgarths or other Incumbrances or placing Seins or Nets across any River to Stop obstruct or Straten the Matural course and passage of Fish in their Seasons for Spawning must be very detrimental and may intirely distroy the Salmon, Bas. Shad Aclivive and Gaspero Fishery, which the New Settlers in General depend on in a great measure for their Subsistance Therefore in Order to preserve that Valuable Support to the Inhabitants of this Government Be it Indained and Ordered by
