

An Ordinance in Amendment of and Addition
 to an Ordinance made and passed the 14th Day of December
 last, Entitled an Ordinance for Granting to His Majesty
 a duty of Impost on Rum and other distilled spirituous
 Liquors —

Whereas there is no provision
 made in the said recited Ordinance for allowing
 a drawback of Duty on Rum and other distilled
 spirituous Liquors that may be Imported into
 this Island, and a^lte^rward Exported or
 re^lshipped for Exportation therefrom, for
 remedy whereof

It is Ordained & Ordered
 by His Honor the President, by and with the
 Advice and Consent of His Majesty's Council,
 and by the Authority of the same; It is hereby
 Ordained and Ordered, that whosoever any
 Person or Persons, from and after the publica-
 =tion hereof, shall export or ship for Exportation

out

Out of this Island or its Dependancies, any Rum
or other Distilled Spirituous Liquors, that have
been Entered at the Office of the Collector or
Collectors of Impost, And upon which the
Duty of Impost has been paid, or secured to be
paid, by virtue of the before recited Ordinance,
the Owner or Stockholder of such Rum or
other Distilled Spirituous Liquors, or the Master
of the Vessel Onboard of which the same is
intended to be Exported, shall first obtain
and take a Permit from the Collector out
of whose District the Exportation is to be
made, to Authorise such Exportation, which
Permit shall specify the Quantity of Rum
or other Distilled Spirituous Liquors, then
to be Exported not being less than two hundred
Gallons —

And be it Ordained & Ordered
that when any Rum or other Distilled Spirituous
Liquors

Liquors shall be Shipped or Laden on Board of any Ship or Vessel for Exportation by Virtue of such Permit. The Master of such Ship or Vessel, or the Stockholder, shall make and subscribe the following Affidavit before the Collector of the District— "I, A. B. do swear the . . . Hundred Gallons of . . . for which I have obtained a Permit from this Office is now actually Shipped on board the Ship Whereof C. D. is Master, bound for and is really and Bona Fide a part of the Stock of the said A. B. Entered at this Office and is now Shipped of the same Proof and Quality, as when the same was Imported, and that the same or any part is not intended to be Landed, Sold, Bartered, or Exchanged in any part of this Island or its Dependencies" which Affidavit shall be filed in the said Collectors Office, And the said Stockholder

or Owner of such Rum or other Distilled Spirituous
Liquors shall be Entitled to a drawback of Duty
of ten pence per Gallon on the Quantity
specified in the said Permit and Affidavit,
when and as soon as he, she, or they shall produce
to the said Collector of Impost a Certificate
from the Collector, or other Chief Officer of
the Customs out of this Island and its
Dependencies, specifying that the same
has actually been landed within his District.

And provided also that no Permit shall be
given by any Collector, nor drawback of
Duty allowed for or upon any less Quantity
than two hundred Gallons of Rum or other
Spirituous Liquor to be Exported, or Shipped
at one time.

And be it Ordained & Ordered
by

by the Authority aforesaid, that if any Master of
 any Ship or Vessel, or any Stockholder, or owner
 of any Rum or other Distilled Spirituous Liquors,
 so Exported or Shipped for Exportation as aforesaid,
 shall be Convicted on the Oath of one
 Credible Witness, of having Relanded, Sold,
 Bartered or Exchanged the same or any part
 thereof within this Island or its Dependancies
 unless the same shall again have been
 Entered at the Office of some Collector of
 Impost in this Island or its Dependancies / He
 She or They, and their Aiders, Abettors and
 Assistants shall be subject and liable to the
 like Penalties and Forfeitures as are
 mentioned in the before recited Ordinance,
 for Importing, Landing, or selling and
 for Assisting in Importing, Landing & selling
 Rum

Rum or other Distilled Spirituous Liqueurs in
this Island or Its Dependencies, without
making Entry thereof, agreeable to the
directions of said Ordinance —

And whereas no Provision
is made in the before recited Ordinance for
the payment of a Treasurer. Be it therefore
Ordained and Ordered by the Authority
aforesaid, that such Person as the Governor
Lieutenant Governor, President, or
Commander in Chief, for the time
being shall or may appoint as Treasurer
by virtue of the before recited Ordinance
shall be empowered, and He is hereby
empowered to retain the Sum of one
Shilling in the Pound, on all Sum or
Sums

Sums of Money that shall or may come into
 his hands as Treasurer of Provincial Revenue,
 which Sum of One Shilling in the Pound
 shall be allowed to him in his Accounts,
 and shall be in full Compensation for his
 services in said Office of Treasurer
