

An Ordinance
 in Addition to, And
 Amendment of An
 Ordinance, Entitled An
 Ordinance for Establishing
 a Parish and Regulating
 the Choise of Church Wardens
 and Vestry Men in the Island
 of Cape Breton made and
 passed the 30th Day of March
 1791.-----

Whereas, in and by the said in part
 recited Ordinance, the Church, Wardens, Vestry and
 other Parish Officers, for the Parish of St. George in
 this Island are Directed to be Elected and Chosen
 Annually On Easter Monday in each and every
 Year, and that the said Church Wardens and
 Vestry cannot officiate as such until they shall
 first produce to the parochial Minister, who is
 Always to be one of the Vestry a Certificate that
 they have respectively taken the Oaths prescribed by
 Law, and subscribed the Declaration against
 Popery: And Whereas the said Parish of St. George
 is at present without an Incumbent or Parochial
 Minister by which the Church Wardens and Vestry
 Men so to be Elected On the ensuing Easter Monday
 could not be qualified according to Law to
 Execute the Duties of their respective Offices

It is therefore thought Necessary and Expedient for the good Order of the church and Real Benefit of the Parish that the present Church Officers who have been Duly qualified should remain and be continued in their respective Offices for One Year more —

Be it therefore Ordained and Ordered by His Honor Lieutenant General Despard - President of His Majesty's Council, with the Consent of the Council that the Election of Parish Officers for the Church and Parish of St. George in this Island which should and Ought to take place On the Enowing Easter Monday in this present Year as in and by the before insart Recited Ordinance is directed shall be and it is hereby Suspended for One Year, and that such of the Parish Officers as were elected and chosen at the Election in the Preceding Year, and are Now alive and Resident in the Island shall be, and they are hereby continued in the full and Due Exercise of their respective Offices Whether as Church Wardens Vestry Men or Otherwise for One Year more that is Until Easter Monday which shall happen in the Year 1807. When the Election shall take place and be had in the Usual and Accustomed Manner and Conformable to and by Virtue of the before insart Recited Ordinance any thing herein contained to the
