It is therefore thought. Recessary and Expedient for the good Order of the church and real benefit of the parish that the present Church Officers. Who have been Duly qualified should lemain and be Continued in their Teopective Offices for One Jear more-Be it therefore Ordained and Orderes by Mis Monor Lieutenant General Despara Resident of Mis Majestys Council, with the Consen of the Council that the Election of Tarish Officers for the Church and Tarish of St. George in this Island which should and Ought to take place On the Enouing Easter Monday in this present Year as in and by the before inpart litted Ordinance is directed shall be and it is hereby Suspended for One Year, and that such of the Tarish Officers as were elected and chosen at the election in the Treceding Hear, and are Now alive and levident in the Island shall be, and they are hereby continued in the full and Due Exercise of their Cospective Offices Whether as Church Wardens Vestry Men or Otherwise for One Mar more that is Until Caster Monday which shall happen in the Tear 180%. When the Election shall take place and be had in the Uneal and accustomed Manner and Confirmable to and by Virtue of the before inpart lecited Ordinance any thing herein Contained to the Contrary
