An Ordinance to Revive
and Continue an Ordinance
for raising a Revenue by
an Impost on Rum and other
Spirituous Liquors made
and passed in Council the
14th Day of December 1701.
and Continued by several 93
Ordinances to the 31st day of
December 1708. When the
said Ordinance Expired.

Whereas the said in part recited Ordinance
has been found by Experience to be useful
and beneficial to this His Majesty's Island
and that it is Expedient the same should be
Revived and Continued for a limited time
Conformable to His Majesty's Gracious
Permission in this Respect Signified.

Be it therefore Ordained and Ordered
by His Honor's Brigadier General Kepear
President of His Majesty's Council hereon
with the Advice and Consent of the said Council
and by the Authority of the same. It is hereby
Ordained and Ordered, that from and After the
Date hereof. the said in part recited Ordinance
and every matter Clause and thing therein mentioned
and Contained shall Revive and take place
and

And Continue in full force and Effect for and during the term of three Years.

And be it further Ordained and Ordered by the Authority Aforesaid that every Person holding or Exercising the Office of Collector of the said Revenue, at the time of and since the Expiration of the before in part recited Ordinance ought to be, and they are hereby Indemnified for any Revenue they have received or are Intitled to receive on any Rum or Spirituous Liquors imported since the Expiration of the before in part recited Ordinance, which Revenue so received or to be received, the said Collector or Collectors are to pay as usual into the Provincial Treasury of this Island, for the use of His Majesty's Government and if the said Collector or Collectors shall be Prosecuted for any thing by him or them done in pursuance of this or the before in part recited Ordinance they may plead the general Issue and give this Ordinance and the special matter in Evidence.
