Regulations not to have effect till confirmed by the Legiflature.

III. Provided always and be it enacted, that no regulation, provision, matter or thing: so proposed, treated. consulted or agreed, shall have conclusive force and effect, or: be carried into execution until the fame shall have been confirmed by the Legislature of the Province.

Commiffichers to lay before the Governor the refult of their conferences.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Commissioners shall, from time to time with all convenient speed, lay the substance of their conferences and confultations, with the agreements by them entered into, before His Excellency the Governor, Licutenant Governor or Person administering the Government, and both Houses of the Provincial Parliament of this Province.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall continue and be in force until the first day of July, which we will be in the year one thousand feven hundred and ninety eight, and no longer.

AN ACT for making a temporary provision for the Regulation of Trade between this Province and the United States of America, by Land or by Inland Navigation. Experio of

Preamble.

HEREAS circumstances require that temporary provision be made for the regulation of Trade and intercourse, between this Province and the United States of America by land or inland navigation, be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, conftituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act, passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the sourteenth year of His Majesly's Reign, intituled" An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebecin North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province; and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that during the continuance of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province, for the time being, with the advice and confent of His Majesty's Executive Council, by order or orders, to be from time to time issued and published, to suspend the operation of the whole, or of any part or parts: of any Ordinance or Ordinances, or of any Act or Acts of the Legislature of this Province, relative to Trade and intercourse by land or by inland navigation, and to give directions and make regulations with respect to importations, exportations, duties or otherwise, for carrying on the trade by land or by inland navigation, between the people and territories of His Majesty, in this Province, and the people and territories of the United States of America; all and every of which suspenfions, directions, and regulations shall have the same force effect and validity as if the same were herein particularly repeated and enacted, any law, statute, custom or usage
