“*Provision for the Government of the said Province;*” And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act and all matters and things therein contained, shall continue and be in force until the first day of January One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer. Provided always, that all and every order or orders issued and published under the authority of the aforesaid Act, or which shall be issued and published under the authority of this Act, shall not continue and be in force longer than to the said first day of January One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament.

C A P. II.

AN ACT further to continue An Act passed in the thirty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled “*An Act for further continuing certain parts of an Act passed in the thirty-fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled; An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens and certain subjects of His Majesty, who have resided in France, coming into this Province or residing therein, and for empowering His Majesty to secure and detain persons charged with or suspected of High Treason, and for the arrest and commitment of all persons who may individually, by seditious practices, attempt to disturb the Government of this Province.*”

So much of Act

WHEREAS an Act was passed by the Legislature of this Province in the thirty-fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled “*An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens and certain Subjects of His Majesty who have resided in France, coming into this Province or residing therein, and for empowering His Majesty to secure and detain persons charged with or suspected of High Treason, and for the Arrest and Commitment of all persons who may individually, by seditious practices, attempt to disturb the Government of this Province,*” which act was to have continuance only until the first day of January One thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Legislature; And Whereas certain parts of the said Act were, by an Act passed in the last Session of the Legislature, continued to the end of the present Session thereof, and it is expedient and necessary that such parts of the said Act should be further continued: Be it therefore enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and consent of the Legislative Council, and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled “*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled “An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Québec in North America, and to make further Provision for the Government of the said Province,*” And it is hereby enacted by the Authority of the same, that so much of the said Act as in any manner relates to the establishment of Regulations respecting Aliens and certain Subjects of His Majesty, who have resided in France for the space of six months, since the tenth day of June One thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine, or who, since that time, have purchased or contracted for in their own names, or in their own behalf, any lands or

real

real Estate, or any stock in the Public Funds of France, and also, as relates to House-keepers with whom any such Aliens may be supposed to reside or lodge, and every clause, provision, regulation, penalty, forfeiture, matter and thing in the aforesaid Act contained, relative to Aliens and such other persons, or to the discovery, imprisonment, punishment, or in any other manner or way whatsoever concerning Aliens and such other persons shall be and the same and every such part of the aforesaid Act is hereby continued until the first day of January, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, and from thence to the close of the present war.

Governor, with advice of the Executive Council, may suspend or revive the operation of the aforesaid Act.

II. Provided always, and it is hereby enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, with the advice and consent of His Majesty's Executive Council, from time to time to suspend, and again, if need be, to revive the operation of the aforesaid Act, or of any part or parts thereof, and in respect to any person or persons, or description of persons designated by this Act, that he shall judge proper and expedient, any thing therein or herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

C A P. III.

AN ACT to ratify, approve and confirm certain provisional Articles of Agreement entered into by the respective Commissioners of this Province and Upper-Canada, at Montreal, on the twenty-eighth January, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, relative to Duties, and for carrying the same into effect.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Articles of Provisional Agreement were made and entered into at Montreal the twenty-eighth day of January in the thirty-seventh year of Your Majesty's reign, by the Commissioners nominated and appointed on behalf of the Province of Lower-Canada by Act of the Legislature thereof, passed in the thirty-sixth year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for appointing Commissioners on behalf of this Province, to treat further with Commissioners on behalf of the Province of Upper-Canada for the Purposes therein mentioned," and the Commissioners nominated and appointed on behalf of the Province of Upper-Canada, in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature thereof passed in the thirty-sixth year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to authorise the Lieutenant Governor to nominate and appoint certain Commissioners for the purposes herein mentioned; which Articles follow:

ARTICLE I. That the Legislature of Upper-Canada will not impose any Duties whatever on any Goods, Wares or Merchandises imported or brought into Lower-Canada, and passing into Upper-Canada, nor on any article, the growth; produce or manufacture of Lower-Canada passing into Upper-Canada, but will allow and admit the Legislature of Lower-Canada to impose and levy such reasonable duties on such Goods, Wares and Merchandises, and such Articles aforesaid, as they may judge expedient for the purpose of raising a revenue within the Province of Lower-Canada.

ART. II. In consideration of the Legislature of Upper-Canada relinquishing the imposition of Duties as aforesaid, the Legislature of Lower-Canada, will allow a just proportion
