Commissioners may require returns by Officers of Customs and examine persons papers, &c. -

THEREAS an Act was paffed by the Legislature of this Province in the thirtyfixth Year of His Majefty's Reign intituled "An Act for appointing Commifioners " on behalf of this Province to treat further with Commission behalf of the Province of Upper-" Cana la for the purp fes therein mentioned," which Act will expire on the first day of the Month of July next: And whereas His Excellency the Governor General, did lay before the Affembly by Meffage, an A& paffed by the Legislature of Upper Canada inituled " An Act to authorife the Lieutenant Governor to nominate and appoint certain Com-" millioners for the purposes therein mentioned" with other papers accompanying the faid Meflage, whereby it becomes expedient for maintaining and promoting a good underflanding, between two Provinces fo intimately connected, to name on behalf of this Province other Commissioners for a further period, We, your Majesty's most dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Reprefentatives of the people of the Province of Lower-Canada in Affembly met, do most humbly befeech your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Moft Excellent Majefty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, conflituted and alienbled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act palled in the Parliament of Great Britain intituled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act paffed in " the fourteenth year of His Majefly's Reign, intituled an AEt for making more effectual pro-" vifion for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America and to make further " provision for the Government of the faid Province," And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that from and after the paffing of this Act, the before mentioned Act of the thirty-fixth year of His Majefty's Reign, and every claufe, power, matter or thing therein contained or thereby granted, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that John Lees, Louis Charles Foucher, Alexander Auldjo, Jofeph Papineau, Thomas Coffin, and Jofeph Perinault, Elquires, fhall be and they are hereby conflituted and appointed Commiftioners on the part of this Province, who, or any three of whom, are authorifed and empowered to meet, treat, confult and agree with fuch Commiflioners as are or may be appointed on the part of the Province of Upper-Canada in virtue of the Act of the Legiflature thereof herein beforementioned, of and concerning the eftablishing of regulations for the Collection of duties or payment of Drawbācks, to be imposed or allowed by the Legiflature of each Province respectively, on Goods; Wares and Merchandiles paffing from one Province into the other; and also of and concerning any proportion to be received or to be paid of any duties already imposed or hereafter to be imposed.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that it shall and may be lawful for the faid Commissioners to require returns to be furnished to them by the proper Officers of His Majesty's Customs, and to fend for and examine such performs, papers and records as they shall judge neccessary for their information, in the execution of the powers vested in the faid Commissioners by this Act.

IV. Provided always and be it enacted and declared, that no regulation, provision, matter or thing fo proposed, treated, confusted or agreed on, shall have conclusive force and effect, or be carried into execution, until the same shall have been confirmed by the Legislature of this Province.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the faid Commifficiers, fhall, with all convenient speed, lay the fubliance of their conferences and confultations, with the agreements by them entered into, before His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government and both Houfes of the Legislature of this Province:

VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid that this Act shall continue in force until the first day of the Month of January which will be in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred.

THEREAS an Act paffed in the thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to provide Returning Officers for Knights, Citizens and Burgeffes to " ferve in Affembly" was by an AEt paffed in the laft Seffion of the Legislature continued to the last day of the Month of December in the prefent year, and that it is neceffary further to continue the laid Act: be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majefty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legiflative Council and Affembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act paffed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled. " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act poffed in the fourteenth year of His Maje/ly's Reign, " intituled, " An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of " Ouebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that the faid Act of the th ry-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, and every part thereof, and every claufe, matter and thing therein contained, are by the prefent Act continued, until the first day of January, in the year One thou fand leven hundred and ninety-nine, and from thence to the end of the then next Sellion of the Provincial Parliament.
