'And from thence continued by several Prorogations to the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred, being the fourth Session of the second Provincial Par- liament of Lower-Canada.

Preamble,

HEREAS an Act was passed by the Legislature of this Province, in the thirty seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the better preservation of His Majesty's Government as by Law happily established in this Province," which Act was to have continuance only until the first day of May one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight; and Whereas the said Act was continued, by an Act passed in the last Session of the Legislature, until the end of the present Session thereof; and Whereas it is expedient and necessary that it be further continued: Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament

HEREAS it is expedient further to continue an Act passed in the Thirty sixth year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, " An Ast for making a " temporary provision for the regulation of Trade between this Province and the United States of " America by land or by inland Navigation," Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Asfembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An A? " to repeal certain parts of an Ast passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty s Reign, intitu-" led, An Att for making more effectual prove fron for the Government of the Province of Quebec " in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province." And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act, intituled, " An Act for making a temporary provision for the regulation of Trade between this Province " and the United States of America by land or by inland Navigation" And all matters and things therein contained, shall continue and be in force, until the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and one, and from thence to the end of the then next Seilion of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer.
