be provided by the Legislature. paid such charge and expence as the urgency of the case may render necessary from time to time, which charge and expence shall be provided for, by the Legislature of this Province as soon thereaster as required.

Duty of the Master of Port. III. And be it further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Master of the Poit or other person or persons so appointed by His Excellency to examine, Vessels arriving, to give such immediate orders to the Master or Masters relating to their anchoring at a distance from the Town or from other ships, or to prevent persons from landing from on board of them, or persons from on shore going on board, or for personning Quarantine, as to the said Master of the Port or person or persons so appointed, shall in his or their discretion appear immediately necessary, by reason of any contagious or infectious disease or diseases on board of such arriving Vessel or Vessels: And all and every Master or Masters, Commander or Commanders of Ships or Vessels from Sea, who shall refuse or neglect to obey the order in writing of the Captain of the Port, or other person, appointed by His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government, for the purposes of this Act, shall incur a penalty of twenty five Pounds sterling, for each and every such his disobedience.

Penalty on Mafters &c. of Veffels for refusal to comply with the orders of the Master of the Port.

Mastersof the Port to frew this Act, with the Querantine Act, to Masters &c of arriving vessels. IV. And to prevent difficulties with the Master or Masters of arriving Vessels, it is hereby further enacted, that the Master of the Port or other person or persons so appointed under this Act, shall shew the same and also the Act of the thirty sists of His present Majesty, Chapter sists, commonly called the Quarantine Act, to the Master or Masters, Commander or Commanders of such arriving ship or ships as aforesaid.

Recovery of Pe-

V. And be it further enacted, that all and every penalty incurred under this Act shall and may be sued for or recovered in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record in this Province by plaint or information, upon the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses: and the said Penalties shall be paid to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors for the Public uses of this Province and the support of the Government thereof, and the due application of the same shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors may direct.

Continuance of this Aft.

VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall continue in force until the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and two, and, from thence to the end of the then next Sellion of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer,

CAP. VI.

An Act sor erecting a Bridge over the River Jacques Cartier.

(29th MAY, 1800.)

Preamble.

THEREAS the River Jacques Cartier, from the violence and rapidity of the current is some times impassable and at all times dangerous. Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeat certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth "year

To build a bridge acre is the River Jacques Cartier.

In case of death &e. of Commillioners others to be appointed.

" year of His Majelly's Reign, intituled, "An Att for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province," And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that it shall and may be lawful to and for His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, by an instrument under his hand and seal at arms, to nominate and appoint three persons for the purpose of erecting the bridge, to be erected in pursuance of this Act, over the River Jacques Cartier, to remove from time to time the said persons or either of them, and to appoint others in the place and stead of such as shall be removed or shall die or refign their trust; and that the said persons to be so aforesaid nominated and appointed, shall be, and they are hereby constituted, Commissioners, for erecting the said Bridge.

Commissioners to fix on a convenient fituation for building the Brid ge.

Not to be binding, until approved of by the Governor. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Commissioners or any two of them, after due examination of the advantages or disavantages of the several reads opened, or that may be opened leading to the said River Jacques Cartier, or to the Bridge already erected thereon and Procès Verbal made thereof, shall six upon some convenient situation on the banks of the said River Jacques Cartier, on which the said Bridge may be most advantageously erected for the immediate benefit of the Royal Post Road; Provided always, that such situation shall by the said Commissioners or any two of them, accompanied by the Procès Verbal herein before mentioned, on the advantages and disadvantages of the several Roads opened or that may be opened leading to the said River Jacques Cartier, be reported to and be approved by His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Perlon administering the Government of this Province for the time being, before the same shall be sinally fixed upon.

On the Governor's approbation being obtained, the Commissioners to built a strong Bridge of stone or wood.

Before the building is commenced a Plan and Estimate of the expense to be laid before the Governor.

And on his approbation being had, the Commitfioners to proceed to the crection of the Eridge.

Commissioners may contract for the building of the Bridge.

Provided that Fublic Notice is to be given in the Quebec Gazette, and the propofals made and approved of.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that when fuch fituation. onthe faid banks of the faid River Jacques Cartier, shall be so as aforesaid fixed upon, with such approbation as aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful for the said Commissioners or any two of them, and they are hereby required to cause to be thereon erected and fimshed a strong and substantial Bridge of stone or wood or of both. Provided always, that before the building of the faid Bridge shall be commenced, the said Commissioners or any two of them, shall and they are hereby directed to cause a Plan of the said Bridge, with an estimate of the expence of erecting the same, to be made, which Plan and Estimate, shall by the said Commissioners or any two of them, be laid before, and approved of by His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the. Government of this Province for the time being; and after such approbation, it shall and may be lawful for the faid Commissioners or any two of them, to proceed forthwith. to the faid Bridge, and to this end to bargain, agree, and contract, with any person or persons for the building of the said Bridge, and for surnishing the Materials therefor in the manner herein after directed; and in default of such bargain and contract, to hire any workmen and labourers for the building of the faid Bridge, or any part or parts of the fame, and to provide any Materials therefor which they the faid Commissioners or any two of them shall find necessary and expedient. Provided always, that when and as foon as fuch approbation as aforefaid shall be obtained, for the crection of the faid Bridge, and before any further steps shall be taken, the said Commissioners or any two of them, shall give Public Notice and information in the Quebec Gazette, of the place. where, and of the materials of which the faid Bridge is to be erected, and of the dimensions of the said Bridge, and by such Notice shall require all persons willing or desirous to contract for the erection of the faid Budge and for furnishing materials therefor offering

offering good and sufficient security for the performance of their Contract, to give in their proposals in writing, with the names of their securities, to them the said Commisfioners within forty days from the date of such Notice: and if upon such notice any proposal or proposals for the erection of the said Bridge and for furnishing materials therefor, with fecurity as aforefaid, shall be made, the same shall forthwith by the said Commissioners be submitted to the consideration of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, and any fuch proposal or proposals, which he shall approve, and for that purpose direct, the said Commissioners shall forthwith cause to be advertised in the Quebec Gazette, and by fuch advertisement shall fur her require all persons willing or defirous to contract for the erection of the laid Bridge and for furnishing materials therefor, with security as aforesaid, at and for any sum less than the sum contained in fuch proposal or proposals so advertised, to give in their further proposals in writing, with the names of their fecurities to them, the faid Commissioners, within thirty days from the date of such Advertisement, after the expiration of which time, it shall and may be lawful to and for the faid Commissioners or any two of them, to close with any fuch proposal so made as aforesaid, if the same and the securities offered for the due performance thereof shall be then approved by His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being. And the faid Commissioners or any two of them in such case shall and may by an instrument in writing, contract and agree with such person or persons, whose propofal or propofals shall have been so approved as aforesaid, and with the person or persons who shall become his or their security or securities in this behalf, for the erection of the faid Bridge and for furnishing materials therefor, and in such instrument shall and may make and enter into all fuch convenants and agreements as shall or may be necessary in this respect for effecting the purposes of this Act.

Governor impowered to advance to the Com missioners a sum not exceeding 15001. IV. And for providing materials and defraying the expences of erecting the said Bridge, Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall and may be lawful to and for His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province, for the time being, out of any unappropriated monies, in the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, to advance to the said Commissioners, any sum, not exceeding the sum of fifteen hundred pounds, current money of this Province.

Commissioners impowered with the consent of the Governor, to bar gain &c. with any person, defirous of building the Bridge at his own expense, and assign over the tolla arting by virtue of this Act, for the term of 30 years.

V. Provided always, and be it further enacted, that it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Commissioners or any two of them, and they are hereby authorised, by and with the consent and approbation of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, to bargain, agree and contract with any person or persons whatsoever, for the building and erecting of the said Bridge, at the proper cost and charges of such person or persons, and to grant and assign over unto such person or persons who shall so undertake to build and erect the said Bridge at their own proper costs and charges, the tolls arising or to arise from the said Bridge, which said tolls shall be collected and taken at the charge of such undertaker, under and by virtue of this Act, for and during the term not exceeding thirty years. Provided also, that the party so undertaking, shall sirft give good and sufficient security that the said Bridge shall be built in a solid and durable manner, and shall be lest in a state of complete repair, to the satisfaction of

variced.

fuch personer persons as may be appointed by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for that purpose, at the end of the faid thirty years.

VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the faid Commissioners from time to time, when thereunto required, shall account to His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, for the application and expenditure of all and every the fum and fums of money to be advanced and difburled in the crestion and finishing of the faid Bridge and in the contingent expenses thereof, in such manner and form as His Excellency the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, shall appoint and direct.

For repaying the money advanced, the following tolls established.

Tolls.

VII. And whereas it is necessary to provide for the repayment of the aforesaid fum. of fifteen hundred pounds or such part thereof as shall to as aforesaid be advanced and expended in the building and erecting of the faid Bridge and furnishing materials therfor, and also for the perpetual maintaining and repairing of the said Bridge; Beit therefore further enacted, that when and as foon as the faid Bridge shall be erected and built, and made fit and proper for the pallage of travelers, cattle and carriages, there shall be paid for pontage, as or in the name of toil, before any passage over the said intended Bridge shall be permitted, the several sums following, that is to say, For every coach or other four wheel carriage, with the driver and four perfons or lefs, drawn by two hories or other bealts of draught, the fum of one failling and fix pence— For every chaife, calash, chair with two wheels, or cariole or other carriage, with the driver and two persons or less, drawn by two Horses or other beasts of draught, the fum of one shilling, and drawn by one horse or other beast of draught, the sum of nine pence.—For every cart, fled, or other carriage drawn by two horses, oxen, or other bealts of draught with the driver, the fum of one shilling, and drawn by one house or other beaft of draught, the fum of nine pence.—For every horse, mare, gelding, mule or als, the fum of four pence half penny.—For every foot pallenger whatloever, the fum of two pence.—For every hog, goat, sheep, calf or lamb, the sum of one penny.— For every bull, ox, cow, and all other horned and neat cattle each, the lum of two pence half penny: And the faid tolls shall be and the same are hereby vested in His. Majesty, his Heirs and Successors for ever, as well for the repayment of the aforesaid fum of fifteen hundred pounds so as aforesaid to be advanced and expended, in the building and erecting of the faid Bridge and furnishing materials therefor, as for the perpetual repairing and maintaining of the faid bridge.

Penalty on ferevade the Touls.

VIII. And be it further enacted, that after the faid Bridge shall be erected and built rying for hir-, to sand made fit and proper for the pallage of travellers, cattle and carriages, no person or persons, whatsoever shall erect or cause to be erected, any ferry boat or canoe for the pasfing or conveying, or shall in any manner pals or convey for hire or gain, any person or persons, cattle, carriage or carriages over the said River Jacques Cartier, within the distance of half a league from the laid Bridge, and if at any time any person or persons shall for hire or gain, pals or convey any person or persons, cattle, carriage or carriages, such offender, shall for every offence, forfeit and pay the sum of ten shittings, recoverable by complaint before any one or more Justices of the Peace, and to be levied by warrant of diffress, under his or their hand and leal, one half of which forfeiture itiall be paid to His Majesty, and the other half to the person suing for the same.

IX. And whereas it may be necessary for the purpose of communicating with the

faid Bridge to change the direction of the King's high way now leading to the ferry of the faid River Jacques Cartier, Be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the Grand Voyer of the aforesaid District of Quebec. shall send an Order to the Surveyor of highways in the Parish through which the said King's highway may pass, to be by him read and published in the usual manner, at the Church door of such Parish. in which order the faid Grand Voyer, shall require the persons interested in the said King's highway, to meet on the day and at the hour and place which he shall fix, to give such: information as they may judge necessary or proper; and after such meeting, the said Grand Voyer, shall go upon the spot to change the direction of such part of the said. King's highway and open such bye road (route) as may be necessary for communicating with the faid Bridge; and the faid Grand Voyer shall fix and allott the work to be performed upon such parts of the King's highway, to be so as aforesaid changed, and upon such bye road which shall be opened as aforesaid: of all which he shall make his-Procès Verbal to be heard, examined and determined upon in due course of Law. Provided always, that if it shall be deemed necessary by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province, to afford any pecuniary assisttance for changing the direction of the faid highway or for opening fuch bye road, as shall be made by virtue of this Act, it shall and may be lawful, to and for the Covernor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, out of the aforesaid sum of fifteen hundred pounds, hereby appropriated to the erection of the Bridge to be built in pursuance of this Act, and to the contingent expences thereof, to advance for that purpole, to the Grand Voyer of the faid District of Quebec, any lum not exceeding the lum of two hundred pounds, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding; for the expenditure of which sum, the said Grand Voyer, whenever thereunto required, shall account, to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, in manner as he or they shall appoint and direct.

The Governor impowered to ad vance to the Grand Voyer 250l. to-wards changing the direction of the King's High-way or for opening a bye-road to the Bridge.

Application of the fines.

X. And be it further enacted, that all the money to be levied by virtue of this Act, and the several fines, forfeitures and penalties hereby imposed, shall be and the same are hereby granted and reserved to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors for the Publicuses of this Province and the Government thereof in manner herein before setsforth and contained, and the due application of such monies, fines, forfeitures and penalties shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, in such manner and form, as he or they shall direct through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury for the time being.

Public A&.

XI. And he it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall judicially be noticed by all Judges, Justices and other persons, without being specially pleaded.
