 “*the Government of the said Province;*” and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act and all matters and things therein contained, shall continue to be in force until the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and seven, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament. Provided always, that after the close of the present war, all and every person or persons committed under the authority of the said Act, shall have the benefit and advantage of the laws relating to or providing for the liberty of the subject, in this Province.

Provided that at the end of the present war persons detained by virtue of this Act, shall have the advantages of the Laws providing for the liberty of the subject.

C A P. II.

An Act further to continue, for a limited time, an Act passed in the thirty sixth year of his Majesty's Reign, intituled, “*An Act for making a temporary provision for the regulation of Trade between this Province and the United States of America, by land or inland navigation.*”

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient further to continue an Act passed in the thirty sixth year of his Majesty's Reign, intituled, “*An Act for making a temporary provision for the regulation of Trade between this Province and the United States of America, by land or by inland navigation,*” Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, “*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, “An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America,*” and to make further provision for the government of the said Province;” and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act intituled, “*An Act for making a temporary provision for the regulation of Trade between this Province and the United States of America, by land or by inland navigation,*” and all matters and

and things therein contained, shall continue and be in force, until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seven, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer. Provided always, that all and every Order or Orders issued and published under the authority of the aforesaid Act, or which shall be issued or published under the authority of this Act, shall not continue and be in force longer than to the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seven, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament.

C A P. III.

An Act for applying a further sum of one thousand Pounds, out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of His Majesty's Receiver General, towards the improvement of the inland navigation of this Province, between Montreal and Lake St. Francis.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it appears by the Report of the Commissioners appointed by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, under the Act of the Legislature passed last Session, intituled "An Act for applying the sum of One Thousand Pounds out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of His Majesty's Receiver General, towards the improvement of the Inland Navigation of this Province," that the effect of the work already done in the removal of some of the impediments in the rapids of Saint Louis in the River Saint Lawrence near to *la Chine*, has surpassed their expectations; and that it would be of great benefit to complete the same; and also to remove the impediments in the navigation for batteaux from Montreal to Lake Saint Francis, but more especially beyond *la Chine*: May it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, *An Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec in North America*," and to make "further provision for the government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province, by warrant or warrants under his hand and seal directed to His Majesty's Receiver General of the same, to issue to the above said Commissioners, or to any two of them, a further sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole one thousand Pounds, current money, out of any unappropriated monies which now are

£1000 to be granted to the Commissioners.
