CAP. I.

HEREAS it is expedient further to continue An Act passed in the thirty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for making a tempora-

" ry provision for the regulation of trade between this Province and the United-States of America by land or by inland navigation," Be it therefore enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of An Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of An Act passed in the fourteenth year " of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Ast for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America" and to make further or provision for the Government of the said Province" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that the faid A&, intituled, " An AEt for making a tem-" porary provision for the regulation of trade between this Province and the United · States of America by land or by inland navigation" and all matters and thingstherein contained, shall continue and be in force until the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eight, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament and no longer. Provided always, that all and every order or orders issued and published under the authority of the aforesaid Act, or which shall be issued or published under the authority of this Act, shall not continue and be in force longer than to the faid first day of January one thousand: eight hundred and eight, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament.
