AN ACT further to continue, for a limited time, the Powers granted to certain Commissioners, by an Act, intituled, "An Act for removing the "o'd Walls and Fortifications that furround the City of Montreal, and "otherwise to provide for the salubity, convenience and embelishment" of the saia City" as also, to continue for all mited time, the extension of the said Powers in certain cases.

THEREAS an Act passed in the forty second year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, " An Att for removing the old Walls and Fortifications that fur-" round the City of Montreal, and otherwife to provide for the faiubrity, convenience and embellishment of the said City," was continued by another Act passed in the forty fifth year of the faid reign, intituled, " An AEt to continue for a limited time the powers granted to certain Commissioners by an Att," intituled, " An Att for remo-" ving the old walls and fortifications that furround the City of Montreal, and other-" wife to provide for the falubrity, convenience and embellishment of the faid City," and " for extending the faid powers in certain cases," and which Acts will expire at the end of the next Session of the Provincial Parliament, after the second day of October next. And whereas the Commissioners, appointed under the first mentioned Act, have been prevented from carrying the powers in them vested fully into execution, by reason of various law suits respecting the ground by them claimed, under the authority of the faid Act, being still pending and undecided; and it being therefore expedient and necellary that the powers of the faid Commissioners should be further continued, for a limited time; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada constituted and assembled, by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Ast to repeal certain parts of an Ast passed in the fourteenth " year of His Majesty's reign," intituled, " An Ast for making more effectual provi-" hion for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America", " and to " make further provision for the Government of the faid Province," and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that all and every of the powers of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, respecting the appointment and removal of the said Commissioners and their Treasurer; as also, all and every of the powers of the Commission

An Act for appropriating a sum of money therein mentioned towards repairing and surnishing the Hospital of the Town of Three Rivers.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

Preamble,

TATHEREAS it is absolutely necessary, that the Hospital of the Town of Three Rivers, destroyed by fire, should be repaired, furnished and provided with every thing needful, and requifite thereto, and whereas the Religious Ladies the Urfulines of the faid Town, although always inclined to continue their care of the fick and of the poor, with that zeal and affiduity that have rendered them fo praifeworthy, finding themselves unable from the loss they sustained by the Confligration. to repair the faid Hospital, and to furnish it in a manner so as to render it of as great utility, as it has hitherto been; May it therefore please Your Majefly, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled. · An Att for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of " Quebec in North America; " and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and it is hereby enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall and may be lawful, to and for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, to pay or cause to be paid to the Religious Ladies the Urfulines of the faid Town of Three Rivers. out of any unappropriated monies, that now are or shall at any time or times here. after, come into the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, the fum of five hundred Pounds, currency, to be by them laid out in and about repairing the faid Hospital of the Town of Three Rivers, and in providing it with every thing needful, and requifite.

Governor &c. empowered to appropriate £ 500 towards repairing the Hospital of Three Rivers.

Application of the money to be accounted for to His Majelly. II, And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the said sum of money, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his here and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the same being, in such manner and form, as His Majesty his heirs and successors shall uncert.
