C A P. XXIX.

AN ACT further to continue, for a limited time, the Powers granted to certain Commissioners, by an Act, intituled, "*An Act for removing the old Walls and Fortifications that surround the City of Montreal, and otherwise to provide for the salubrity, convenience and embellishment of the said City*" as also, to continue for a limited time, the extension of the said Powers in certain cases.

WHEREAS an Act passed in the forty second year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act for removing the old Walls and Fortifications that surround the City of Montreal, and otherwise to provide for the salubrity, convenience and embellishment of the said City*," was continued by another Act passed in the forty fifth year of the said reign, intituled, "*An Act to continue for a limited time the powers granted to certain Commissioners by an Act*," intituled, "*An Act for removing the old walls and fortifications that surround the City of Montreal, and otherwise to provide for the salubrity, convenience and embellishment of the said City*," and "*for extending the said powers in certain cases*," and which Acts will expire at the end of the next Session of the Provincial Parliament, after the second day of October next. And whereas the Commissioners, appointed under the first mentioned Act, have been prevented from carrying the powers in them vested fully into execution, by reason of various law suits respecting the ground by them claimed, under the authority of the said Act, being still pending and undecided; and it being therefore expedient and necessary that the powers of the said Commissioners should be further continued, for a limited time; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada constituted and assembled, by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign*," intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Québec in North America*," and to "*make further provision for the Government of the said Province*," and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that all and every of the powers of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, respecting the appointment and removal of the said Commissioners and their Treasurer; as also, all and every of the powers of the Commis-

oners, and their Treasurer so appointed or to be appointed, which are in them vested by the Acts, or either of the Acts above mentioned, is and are hereby further continued, and shall remain in full force and effect, for and during the space of four years, from and after the second day of October next; and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer.

C A P. XXX.

An Act for appropriating a sum of money therein mentioned towards repairing and furnishing the Hospital of the Town of Three Rivers.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is absolutely necessary, that the Hospital of the Town of Three Rivers, destroyed by fire, should be repaired, furnished and provided with every thing needful, and requisite thereto, and whereas the Religious Ladies the Ursulines of the said Town, although always inclined to continue their care of the sick and of the poor, with that zeal and assiduity that have rendered them so praiseworthy, finding themselves unable from the loss they sustained by the Conflagration; to repair the said Hospital, and to furnish it in a manner so as to render it of as great utility, as it has hitherto been; May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America*;" and to make further provision for the Government "of the said Province," and it is hereby enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall and may be lawful, to and for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of the Province for the time being, to pay or cause to be paid to the Religious Ladies the Ursulines of the said Town of Three Rivers, out of any unappropriated monies, that now are or shall at any time or times hereafter, come into the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, the sum of five hundred Pounds, currency, to be by them laid out in and about repairing the said Hospital of the Town of Three Rivers, and in providing it with every thing needful, and requisite.

Governor &c. empowered to appropriate £500 towards repairing the Hospital of Three Rivers.

Application of the money to be accounted for to His Majesty.

II, And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the said sum of money, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form, as His Majesty his heirs and successors shall direct.
