“ entered into by the respective Commissioners of this Province, and of Upper Canada, at Montreal, on the fifth day of July, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Four, relative to duties, and for carrying the same into effect, and also further to continue an Act passed in the Thirty-Seventh year of His Majesty's reign,” which Articles of Agreement and which Acts will expire on the first day of March, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Nine. And in order to avoid the necessity of a new appointment of Commissioners, it is expedient and proper that the said Act be further continued for a limited time. May it therefore please Your Most Excellent Majesty, that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled: “ An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled; “An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America” “ And to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,” And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the above mentioned Act, passed in the forty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign; And the said Provisional Articles of agreement, as also the abovesaid Act, passed in the thirty-seventh year of His Majesty's reign, and each of them, and all and every article, clause, obligation, penalty, fine, forfeiture, matter and thing therein contained be, and the same is, and are hereby continued, and shall be in force to the twenty-fifth day of March, which will be in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eleven, and no longer. Provided always, that the Provincial Parliament of Upper Canada, do continue to the like period, the duties imposed by an Act thereof, passed in the forty-seventh year of His Majesty's reign, intituled: “ An Act for granting to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, to and for the uses of this Province, the like duties on Goods and Merchandize, brought into this Province, from the United States of America; as are now paid on Goods and Merchandize imported from the United States of America into the Province of Lower Canada.”

C A P. VI.

AN ACT which declares in whom is vested the power of granting *des Lettres de Terrier* in this Province.

(14th April, 1808.)

Preamble.

WHEREAS before the conquest of Canada, the right of granting *des Lettres de Terriers* was vested in the Intendant in this Country as representing His most Christian Majesty the King of France. And whereas doubts have arisen in regard to where the said power is now vested, and it becomes expedient to declare and enact thereon. Be it therefore declared and enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty

Power of granting des lettres de terrier vested in His Excellency the Governor.

Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled: "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled: "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America" "And to make further provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby declared and enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the power of granting *des Lettres de Terrier*, within this Province, is vested in the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of the Province of Lower Canada, for the time being, as representing the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

C A P. VII.

AN ACT to permit the Provincial Court of Appeals to be holden and kept in such place as the Governor shall appoint.

(14th April, 1808.)

Preamble.

Clause in Act 39 Geo. 3. cap. 10. recited.

Governor empowered to appoint the place for holding the Court of Appeals.

WHEREAS in and by an Act made and passed in the thirty-ninth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for erecting Court Houses with proper Offices in the several Districts of Quebec and Montreal, and for defraying the expences thereof," It is amongst other things enacted, that the Provincial Court of Appeals and divers other Courts in the said Act particularly mentioned, shall be holden and kept in the Court Houses, in the said Districts respectively, any Law, custom or usage to the contrary notwithstanding. And whereas it may be necessary that the Provincial Court of Appeals should occasionally be holden and kept elsewhere. Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled: "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act, passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled: "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America" "And to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the passing of this Act, the Provincial Court of Appeals shall be holden and kept in such place and places, within the City of Quebec, as the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, for the time being, by Warrant, under his Hand and Seal at Arms, directed to the Clerk of the said Provincial Court of Appeals, shall, from time to time, appoint, any thing in the above in part recited Act contained, to the contrary notwithstanding.
