AT the Provincial Parliament, begun and holden at Quebec, the Tenth day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and nine, in the fortyninth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith."

Being the First Session of the Fifth Provincial Parliament of Lower-Canada.

CAP. I.

AN ACT further to continue, for a limited time, an Act passed in the forty third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the better preservation of His Majesty's Government as by Law happily established in this Province."

(15th May, 1809.)

HEREAS an Act was passed by the Legislature of this Province in the forty third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, an Act for the better preser-

" vation of His Majesty's Government as by Law happily established in this Province," which Act will expire at the end of the present Session of this Provincial Parliament; and whereas it is expedient and necessary that the faid Act should be further continued: Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act " to repeal certain parts of an Act palled in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's " Reign, intituled, " An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government " of the Province of Quebec, in North America," and to make further provision for " the Government of the faid Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act intituled, " An Act for the better preservation of His " Majesty's Government as by Law happily established in this Province," and all matters and things therein contained, shall continue to be in force until the first day of January, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ten, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament and no longer.

THEREAS an Act was passed in the thirty fixth year of His Majesty's Reign. intituled, " An Act for making a temporary provision for the Regulation of " Trade between this Province and the United States of America, by land or by inland " navigation," which Act was continued and amended by another Act passed in the forty eighth year of His Majelly's Reign, intituled, . An Act to continue for a " limited time an Act passed in the thirty sixth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for making a temporary provision for the Regulation of Trade between this " Province and the United States of America, by land or inland navigation." And Whereas it is expedient further to continue the said two Acts: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act " passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Att for " making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in " North America," and to make further provision for the Government of the laid " Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority, of the same, that the said Act, intituled, " An Act for making a temporary provision for the Regulation of
