rect the money to be advanced and applied agreeable to the obvious intention of the Legislature; and it is necessary and just that the money to advanced and applied fhould be made good, so that the amount may be charged as if the faid accidental error had not occurred : Be it therefore enacted by the King's Moft Excellent Majefty, by and with the advice and confent of the Legiflative Council and Affembly of the Province of Lower Canada, conftituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act " to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majefty's " Reign, intituled, " An AEt for making more effectual Provision for the Govern-" ment of the Province of Quebec, in North America," and to make further provision " for the government of the faid Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that out of any unappropriated monics in the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, arifing under all or any of the Acts of the Provincial Parliament, there shall be iffued and applied a fum, not exceeding twelve hundred Pounds, current money of this Province, to make good the fum or fums which may have been iffued and applied as aforefaid, towards the relief and fupport of such unfortunate persons, as may, from derangement of intellect, have been incapable of carning their fultenance, or towards the maintenance of fuch new born infants as may have been inhumanly exposed or deferted and required protection, or towards the relief of fick or infirm perfons, or towards the aid and support of fuch Religious Communities as may have received and administered relief to perfons of the above descriptions, between the first day of April one thousand eight hundred and eight, and the first day of April one thousand eight hundred and nine, inclusive.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the due application of the fum or fums of money iffued, as aforefaid, fhall be accounted for to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, through the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury for the time being, in fuch manner and form as His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors fhall be pleafed to direct.

CAP. IV.

An Act further to continue the Acts therein mentioned, respecting Aliens and certain Subjects of His Majesty who have resided in France, coming into this Province or residing therein.

WHEREAS an Act was paffed in the forty third year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing regulations respecting Aliens and certain "Subjects

" Subjects of His Majefly who have refided in France, coming into this Province or " refiding therein," and another Act was paffed in the forty eighth year of His Majefty's Reign. intituled, " An Act further io continue, for a limited time, and amend " an Act paffed in the forty third year of. His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act " for establishing regulations respecting Aliens and certain Subjects of His Majesty who " have relived in France coming into this Province, or residing therein," which faid Acts will both expire at the end of the present Setsion of the Provincial Parliament. And Whereas it is neceffary and expedient that the faid Acts be further continued: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and confent of the Legislative Council and Astembly of the Province of Lower Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act paffed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, " An Act to repeal certain " paits of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An AEt for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province. of " Quebcc, in North America," and to make further provision for the government of " the faid Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the fame, that the faid Act intituled, "An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens and certain Subjects of His Majefly who have resided in France coming into this Pro-" vince or residing therein," and also the faid Act, intituled, " An Act further to " continue for a limited time and amend an Act paffed in the forty third year of His " Majefly's Reign, intituled, " An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens " and certain Subjects of His Majesty who have resided in France coming into this " Province or residing therein," and all matters and things in the faid Acts contained shall continue and be in force until the first day of January, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ten, and from thence to the end of the then next Selfion of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act may be altered, amended or repealed by any Act or Acts to be made in this present Seffion of the Legislature.

CAP. V.

AN ACT to declare the forty Stalls erected by order of the Magistrates of the City of Montreal, on the new Market place, to be in lieu of, and confidered as the Market House, with Stalls, intended by an Act of the forty seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, Chapter seventh; and to put in force the other Provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS forty commodious and durable Stalls for the purpole of felling Butcher's Meat have been crected in the new Market Place of the City of Montreal, and that there full remains space for crecting others of fimilar construction.
