And whereas His Excellency the Governor in Chief, to remedy this accidental error in the said Act, hath been pleased to direct the money to be advanced and applied agreeable to the obvious intention of the Legislature; and it is necessary and just that the money so advanced and applied should be made good, so that the amount may be charged as if the said accidental error had not occurred: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's " Reign, intituled, " *An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Govern- " ment of the Province of Quebec, in North America,*" and to make further provision " for the government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the au- thority of the same, that out of any unappropriated monies in the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, arising under all or any of the Acts of the Pro- vincial Parliament, there shall be issued and applied a sum, not exceeding twelve hundred Pounds, current money of this Province, to make good the sum or sums which may have been issued and applied as aforesaid, towards the relief and sup- port of such unfortunate persons, as may, from derangement of intellect, have been incapable of earning their sustenance, or towards the maintenance of such new born infants as may have been inhumanly exposed or deserted and required protection, or towards the relief of sick or infirm persons, or towards the aid and support of such Religious Communities as may have received and administered relief to per- sons of the above descriptions, between the first day of April one thousand eight hundred and eight, and the first day of April one thousand eight hundred and nine, inclusive.

The money to be accounted for to His Majesty.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due applica- tion of the sum or sums of money issued, as aforesaid, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors shall be pleased to direct.

#### C A P. IV.

An Act further to continue the Acts therein mentioned, respecting Aliens and certain Subjects of His Majesty who have resided in France, coming into this Province or residing therein.

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS an Act was passed in the forty third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " *An Act for establishing regulations respecting Aliens and certain " Subjects*

"Subjects of His Majesty who have resided in France, coming into this Province or residing therein," and another Act was passed in the forty eighth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act further to continue, for a limited time, and amend an Act passed in the forty third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing regulations respecting Aliens and certain Subjects of His Majesty who have resided in France coming into this Province, or residing therein," which said Acts will both expire at the end of the present Session of the Provincial Parliament. And Whereas it is necessary and expedient that the said Acts be further continued: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America," and to make further provision for the government of the said Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act intituled, "An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens and certain Subjects of His Majesty who have resided in France coming into this Province or residing therein," and also the said Act, intituled, "An Act further to continue for a limited time and amend an Act passed in the forty third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens and certain Subjects of His Majesty who have resided in France coming into this Province or residing therein," and all matters and things in the said Acts contained shall continue and be in force until the first day of January, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ten, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer.

## C A P. V.

AN ACT to declare the forty Stalls erected by order of the Magistrates of the City of Montreal, on the new Market place, to be in lieu of, and considered as the Market House, with Stalls, intended by an Act of the forty seventh year of His Majesty's Reign, Chapter seventh; and to put in force the other Provisions of the said Act.

Preamble.

WHEREAS forty commodious and durable Stalls for the purpose of selling Butcher's Meat have been erected in the new Market Place of the City of Montreal, and that there still remains space for erecting others of similar construction,
