

This Act not to continue in force certain clause contained in the Act 48. Geo. 3. Cap. 27.

II. Provided always, and it is hereby enacted by the authority aforesaid, that nothing in this Act contained shall extend or be construed to extend to continue in force the fifth or the seventeenth sections of the said Act, intituled, "An Act for the better regulation of the Lumber Trade," or either of them, or any matter or thing in the said sections or either of them contained.

Penalty on Master Cullers or Measurers buying or selling Lumber.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this Act, it shall not be lawful for any Master Cullers or measurers appointed by virtue of the said Provincial Act of the forty-eighth year of His Majesty, Chapter twenty-seventh, or who shall be appointed under the authority of the present Act to buy, sell or trade in any manner, either by themselves or their Agents or Deputies, in any description of Lumber subject to inspection, upon pain of being dismissed from their employment, and subject moreover to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds Current money of this Province, nor less than thirty pounds like Currency, the which penalty and fine, shall be sued for, paid and applied in the same manner and as is provided by the said Act of the forty-eighth year.

### C A P. XV.

AN ACT for the relief of insane persons and for the support of Foundlings and others therein mentioned.

(21st March, 1811.)

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient to provide for the support of such unfortunate persons as may, from derangement of intellect, be incapable of earning their subsistence, and towards the maintenance of such new born Infants as may be hereafter, or have been heretofore inhumanely exposed and deserted, and require protection, and towards the aid and support of such religious Communities as receive and administer relief to persons of the above description, and that the Provisions for that purpose of the Act of the Forty-eighth Year of His Majesty's Reign, Chapter eleventh, will expire on the first day of April next: Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of, an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the Fourteenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America," And to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," And it is hereby enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the first day of April eighteen hundred and eleven, it shall and may be lawful to and for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, out of any unappropriated monies in the hands or which may come into the hands of the Receiver General of this Province,

arising under all or any of the Acts of the Provincial Parliament, to apply and appropriate a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred pounds *per annum* towards the relief and support of such unfortunate persons as may, from derangement of Intellect, be incapable of earning their sustenance, and towards the maintenance of such new born Infants as may be hereafter or have been heretofore inhumanely exposed or deserted, and require protection, as also towards the relief of sick and infirm persons and towards the aid and support of such Religious Communities as receive and administer relief to persons of the above description, and the sum hereby appropriated shall be applied in such manner and under such regulations as the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government shall judge most expedient for promoting the ends of this Act. Provided always, that the present Act shall continue and remain in force until the first day of April in the year of Our Lord one thousand, eight hundred and thirteen, and no longer.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners who may be appointed for carrying this Act into execution or any two of them, whenever any such Foundlings shall in the judgment of the said Commissioners have attained a proper age, to bind them out Apprentices, or from time to time to place them out with such person or persons, and on such terms and conditions as to such Commissioners or any two of them shall be considered fit, Provided always, that the term of any such Apprenticeship or of such placing out shall not, in any case, exceed the age of twenty one years.

### C A P. XVI.

AN ACT for granting another sum of money to finish the building of the Common Goal for the District of Montreal,

(21st. March, 1811.)

Preamble.

WHEREAS the sum already appropriated by law for the purpose of erecting a common Goal for the District of Montreal, has been found insufficient, and that it appears expedient to apply another sum of money for completing of the said common Goal and the appendages thereof, and to provide as soon as possible, therein safe and salubrious lodgings for the Prisoners: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain part of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America," and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and it is hereby enacted by the authority of
