Montreal and the Town of Three Rivers, also for extending regulations of Police to other Towns and Villages in certain cases and for repealing the acts or Ordinances therein mentioned;" and all and every the matters and things therein contained (except such parts thereof as are repealed by the aforesaid act of the sisty-first year of His Majesty's Reign) shall be and are hereby continued in force from and after the expiration thereof until the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sisteen and no longer. PROVIDED always that all and every order or orders is under the authority of the aforesaid act, passed in the forty second year of His Majesty's Reign so continued and amended, or which shall be issued and published under the authority of this act shall continue to be in sorce until the said sirst day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sifteen, and no longer.

Continuance of the orders, under the aforesaid Acts.

CAP. X.

An Act to authorise François Frichette, to build a Bridge over the River du Sud, in the County of Devon, to fix the Rates of Toll for palling thereon, and to provide Regulations for the said Bridge.

(15th. February, 1813.)

Preamble.

HEREAS the crection of a Bridge over the River du Sud, in the County of Devon would much augment the convenience and facility of the intercourse of the Inhabitants of the adjacent Parishes and concessions, and of the Public in general; And whereas François Frichette, of the Parish of St. Thomas, in the said county of Devon, by his Petition in this behalf, hath prayed leave to erect a Toll Bridge over the faid River du Sud, May it therefore please Your most Excellent Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, . An Act to repeal certain parts of an act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majes-" ty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Governse ment of the Province of Quebec in North America;" und to make further provision " for the Government of the faid Province;" and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the said François Frichette, and he is hereby authorised and empowered, at his own costs and charges, to erect and build a good and substantial Bridge over the faid River du Sud, at the usual place of passage in fummer or near such place of passage, and to each and build one Toll House and Turnpike with other dependencies on or near the faid Bridge, and also to do, perform and execute all other matters and things requilite and necessary, useful or convenient, for erecing and building, maintaining and supporting the faid intended Bridge, Toll House, Turnpike and other dependencies according to the tenor

Prançois Frichette authorised to build a Bridge over the River du Sud,

and true meaning of this Act: and further, that for the purpose of erecting. building, maintaining or supporting the said Bridge, the said François Frichet, his heirs, executors, curators and affigns, shall, from time to time, have full power and authority to take and use the land, on either side of the said River du Sud, and there to work up or cause to be worked up the materials and other things necessary for erecting, constructing or repairing the said Bridge accordingly: the staid François Frichet, his heirs, executors, curators or affigns, and the persons by him or them employed, doing as little damage as may be, and making reasonable and just fatisfaction to the respective owners and occupiers of all such lands and grounds as shall be altered, damaged or made use of for the value of such land as well as for that of the alteration or of the damages, which they may cause to the proprietors. by means of or for the purpole of erecting the faid Bridge and the faid Houle as above designated; and in case of difference of opinion and dispute about the quantum of fuch fatisfaction, the same shall be settled by His Majesty's Court of King's Bench, of and for the District of Quebec, after a previous visitation, examination and estimation of the premises shall have been made by Experts, to be named by the Parties respectively: and in default of such nomination by them, or other of them, then by the faid Court, in manner and form prescribed by law, and the said Court is hereby authorised and empowered to hear, settle and finally determine the amount of such compensation in consequence. Provided always, that the said François Frichet, his heirs or successors shall not commence the erection of the said Bridge and other works, by which any person may be deprived of his land or of part thereof, or may fuffer damage before the price or value of the faid land and damages estimated and settled in the manner before prescribed, shall have been paid to fuch person, or after such price or value shall have been offered to him or that on his refusal, the said François Frichet shall have deposited it at the Office of the Court of King's Beach for the District of Quebec.

Proviso.

The Bridge, &c.vested in François Frichet, his heirs and Assigns for ever.

After the expiration of 50 years His Majesty may assume the possession of the said Bridge, &c. pay-Fricket, the full value the of, When the Bridge is built and fit for the passage of Travellers, François Frichet, &c. authorised to take for Pontage certain Tolls.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the faid Bridge and the said Toll House, Turnpike and dependences to be erected the con, or near thereto, and also the atcents or approaches to the said Bridge, and all materials. which shall be from time to time gotten or provided, for ereding, building, or making, maintaining and repairing the lame, that be vested in the faid François Frichet, his heirs and affigns for ever. Provided, that after the expiration of fifty years, to be accounted from the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty. his heirs and fuccessors, to assume the possession and property of the laid Bridge. Toll House, Turnpike and dependencies, and the ascents and approaches thereto. upon paying to the faid François Frichet, his Heirs, Executors, Curators or Affigns, the full and entire value which the same may at the time of such assumption. bear and be worth; and when and to foon as the faid Bridge shall be erected and built, and made fit and proper for the pallage of Travellers, Cattle and Carriages, and that the same shall be certified by any two or more Justices of the Peace, for the District of Quebec, after examination thereof by three Experts, to be appointed and Iworn by the laid Justices, and be advertised in the Quebec Gazette, it hall be lawful for the faid François Frichet, his heirs, executors, curators and affigns. from

from time to time and at all times, to ask, demand, receive, recover and take tolks and for their own proper use and behoof, for Pontage, as or in the name of at Political or Duty, before any passage over the said Bridge, shall be permitted; the several fums following, that is to fay, for every Coach or other four wheel Carriage, loaded or unloaded, with the Driver and four Persons, or less, drawn by two or more Horses, or other beasts of draught, on shilling and three pence currency; for every Chaife, Calath, Chair, with two wheels or Cariole, or other fuch Carriage. loaded or unloaded, with the Driver and two Persons, or less, drawn by two Horses or other beafts of draught, fix pence, corrency; and drawn by one Horse or other beaft of draught, five pence, currency; for every Cart, Sled or other such Carriage, loaded or unloaded, drawn by two Horfes, Oxen or other Beafts of draught, with the Drivers five pence, currency; and if drawn by one Horse, or other Beast of draught, four pence, currency; for every person on foot, one penny, currency; for every Horse, Mare, Mule, or other Beast of draught, laden, orunladen two pence half? penny, corrency; for every person on horseback, two pence half penny, currency : for every Bull, Ox, Cow and all other houned and neat Cattle, each, one pennys half penny, currency; for every Hog, Goat; Sheep; Calf or Lamb, one half penny, cirrency.

Exception in certain cases.

François Frichet may reduce and afterwards adrance the Tolls.

Table of rates to be fixed in some conspicuous place at each Toll Gate.

Tolls vested in François Frichet.

Unless His Mnjesty, at the end of 50 years shall assume the possesion of the Bridge &c, thenthe same shall be yested in his Majesty.

III. Provided always and be it further enacted by authority aforefaid, that not person, Horse or Carriage employed in conveying a Mail or Letters under the authority of His Majesty's Post Office, nor for the Horses, or Carriages, laden or nor laden, and Drivers attending Officers and Soldiers of His Majefty's Forces, or of the Militia, whilst upon their march or on duty, nor the faid Officers or Soldiers. or any of them, nor . Carriages, and Drivers or Guards lent with prisoners of any description, shall be chargeable with any Toll or rate whatsoever. Provided also that it shall and may be lawful for the said François Frichet, his heirs, executors, curators or assigns to diminish the said Tolls, or any of them, and asterwards if he or they shall see fit again to augment the same, or any of them, Novas now to exceed. in any case the rates herein before authorised to be takens. Provided also, that the faid François Frichet, his heirs executors, curators, or affigus fliable affix or caulet each to be affixed, in some conspicuous place, at or near such Toll-Gate, a Table of the Rates payable for passing over the said Bridge; and so often as such rates may be diminished or augmented; he or they half cause such alteration to be affixed, incl manner aforefaid.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Tolls, shall be, and the same are hereby vested in the said François Frichet, his heirs and assigns for ever. Provided, that if His Majisty shall, in the manner herein before, mentioned, after the expiration of sifty years, from the passings of this Act, as fome the possession and property of the said Bridge, Toll-House, Turnpike and despendencies, and the ascents and approaches thereto, them the said Volks shally from the time of such assumption, appertain and belong to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, who shall from thence forward be substituted in the place and stead of the said François Frichet, his heirs and assigns, for all and every the purpose of this Act.

Penalty on persons forcibly passing the Turnpike without paying Tolls or who shall obstruct the said Prançois Frichet in building the Bridge, &c.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that if any person, shall, forcibly pass through the said Turnpike, without paying the Toll or any part thereof; or shall interrupt or disturb the said François Frichet, his heirs, executors, curators or assigns, or any person or persons employed by him, or them, for building or repairing the said Bridge or making or repairing the way over the same, or anyroad or avenue leading thereto, every person so offending, in each of the cases aforesaid, shall, for every suchoffence, sorseit a sam not exceeding forty shillings, currency.

As soon as the Bridge is completed, no other bridge to be erected within half a league above, and as far as the Falis below the said Bridge.

m VI.}$ And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that as foon as the faid-Bridge shall be passable and opened for the use of the public, no person or persons shall erect, or canse to be crected, any Bridge or Bridges or Works or use any Ferry for the Carriage of any Persons, Cattle or Carriages whatlosver, for hire, across the said-River do Sud within, half a league, above the faid Bridge, and below the faid Bridge to the Falls of the River du Sud: and if any person or persons shall erect a Toll Bridge or Toll Bridges over the faid River within the faid limits, he or they shall pay to the faid François Frichet, his heirs, executors curators and affigns, treble the Tolis here by imposed, for the persons, Cattle and Carriages, which shall pass over such Bridge or Bridges; and if any person or persons shall, at any time, for hire or gain, pass or convey any person or persons, Cattle, or Carriages, across the faid River within the limits aforefaid, fuch Offender, or Offenders, shall, for each Carriage. Person or Animal so carried across, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding forty Shilling, currency. Provided that nothing in this Act contained, shall be construed to prevent the public from passing any of the Fords, in the said River within the limits aforesaid, or Canoes without gain or hire.

Penalty.

Proviso.

Penalty on persons pulling down the Bridge or Toll Houses. VII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that if any person shall maliciously pull down, burn or destroy the said Bridge, or any part thereof, or the Toll House to be erected by virtue of this Act, every person so offending, shall be deemed guity of Felony.

François Frichet required to erect the Toll &c. within five years... VIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Francois Frichet, to entitle himself to the benefits and advantages to him, by this Act
granted, shall and he is hereby required to erect and complete the said Toll-House,
Turnpike and dependencies within five years from the day of the passing of this Act;
and if the same shall not be completed within the time last mentioned, so as to afford
a convenient and safe passage, over the said Bridge, he the said François Frichet,
his heirs, executors, curators and assigns, shall cease to have any right, title or
claim of, in or to the Tolls hereby imposed, which shall from thence so ward
belong to His Majesty; and the said François Frichet, shall not, by the said Tolls,
or in any other manner or way, be entitled to any reimbursement of the expences
he may have incurred in and about the building of the said Bridge; and in case the

Penalty if not completed.

Temporary Bridge to be c-

faid Bridge, after it shall have been erested and completed, shall, at any time, become impassable or unsafe for Travellers, Cattle or Carriages, he the said François Frichet, his heirs, executors, curators or affigns, shall, and th y are hereby required, within two years from the time at which the faid Bridge shall, by His Maiesty's Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, in and for the said District of Quebec, be ascertained to be impassable or unsafe, and notice thereof, to him or them, by the faid Court given, to canfe the same to be rebuilt or repaired. and made fafe and commodious for the passage of Travellers, Cattle and Carriages,; and if within the time last mentioned, the laid Bridge be not so repaired or rebuilt, as the case may require, then the said Bridge or such part or parts thereof, as shall be remaining, shall be, and be taken and considered to be the property of His Majesty; and after such default to repair or rebuild the said Bridge, the said François Frichet, his heirs, executors, curators or affigns, shall cease to have any right, title or claim of, in, to or out of the faid Bridge or the remaining parts thereof, and the Tolls hereby granted, and his and their rights in the premiffes, shall be wholly and for ever determined. Provided always that to secure to the public a free passage during the said five years, the said François Frichet, shall during the next semmer erect a temporary Bridge or props (Chevalets) which Bridge or props (Chevalets) the faid François Frichet, shall cause to be approved by two Justices of the Peace before demanding the herein before mentioned rates of Toll upon the same, and he shall every year keep the said temporary Bridge in a good state of fasety and passable from the time of the breaking up of the Ice until the said River du Sud is passable upon the Ice in Autumn, above the rapids and during the time that the laid Bridge or props (Chevalets) cannot be placed anew in the Ipring, the faid François Frichet, shall have and keep Canoes for the passage of the Public at and for the same rates.

Not to affect the King's Rights. IX. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the present AA or any of the dispositions therein contained, shall not extend or be construed to extend to weaken diminish or extinguish the rights and privileges of His Majesty, the King, his heirs and successors, nor of any person or persons, body politic or corporate in any of the things therein mentioned, (except as to the powers and authority hereby given to the said François Frichet, his heirs and assigns and except to the rights which are hereby altered or extinguished) but that His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, and all and every person or persons, body politics or corporate, their heirs, and assigns, executors and administrators shall have, and exercise the same rights (with the exceptions aforesaid) as they, and each of them had before the passing of this A&, to every effect and purpose what soever, and in as ample manner as if this a& had never been passed.

Penaltics how recoverable.

X. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the penalties hereby inflicted, shall, upon proof of the offences respectively before any one or more of the Justices of Peace for the District or Quehec, either by contession of the Offender,

fender, or by the Oath of one or more credible Witness or Witnesses, (which Oath such Justice is hereby empowered and required to administer,) be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattles of such Offender, by warrant figned by such Justice or Justices, and the overplus, after such penalties and the charges of such distress and sale are deducted, shall be returned upon demand to the owner of such goods and chattles, one half of which penalties, respectively, when paid and levied, shall belong to His Majesty, and the other half to the person suing for the same.

Money levied by this Act and not granted to Francois Frichet, and the several fines and penaltics, granted to His Majesty, to be accounted for to His Majesty.

XI, And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the money to be levied by virtue of this Act, and not herein before granted to the faid François Frichet, his heirs and affigns, and the several Fines and Penalties hereby inflicted, shall be, and the same are hereby granted, and reserved to His Majesty; his heirs and successors, for the public uses of this Province; and the Government thereof, in manner herein before set forth and contained; and the due application of such money, fines and penalties shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his heirs and fuccessors, in such manner and form, as he or they shall direct, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being.

Public Act. XII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall be deemed a public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such, by all Judges, Justices of the Peace and all other persons whomsoever, without being specially pleaded.
