" charges of the administration of Justice, and support of the Civil Government, within this Province, and for other purposes therein mentioned," and under and by virtue of another Act passed in the Thirty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for granting to His Majesty, duties on Licences to Hawkers, Pedlars and " Petty Chapmen, and for regulating their Trade, and for granting additional duties " on Licences to perfors for keeping Houses of Public Entertainment or for retail-" ing Wine, Brandy, Rum or other Spirituous Liquors in this Province, and for " regulating the same, and for repealing the Act or Ordinance therein mentioned."

Sums directed to be charged, to accounted for to His Majesty.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the due application make good the of the fum or fums directed to be charged as aforefaid, to make good and pay any deficiency, to be deficiency as aforesaid as by this Act is directed, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form, as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall direct.

CAP. XVIII.

AN ACT to provide for the holding of the Provincial Court of Appeals during the repairs to be done to the Court House at Quebec.

(25th March, 1815.)

Preamble.

TYHEREAS in and by Act made and passed in the Thirty-ninth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for erecting Court Houses, with pro-66 per offices, in the leveral Diffricts of Quebec and Montreal, and for defraying the es expenses thereof"; it is amongst other things, enacted, that the Provincial Court of Appeals and divers other Courts in the faid A& particularly mentioned, shall be holden and kept in the Court Houses in the said Districts respectively, any Law, custom or usage to the contrary notwithstanding; and whereas it may be necessary that the Provincial Court of Appeals, should occasionally be holden and kept elsewhere during the making of the repairs of the Court House of Quebec; Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act paffed " in the fourteenth year of His Myjesty's Reign, intit led, "An Ast for making " more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North " America;" And to make further provision for the Government of the laid Pro-" vince." And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that from and after the paffing of this Act, the Provincial Court of Appeals shall be holden and kept in such place and places, within the City of Quebec, as the Governor, Lieutenant Governor

Court of Appeals may be holden in such place, in the City of Quebec. as the Governor may appoint.

Governor or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being. by Warrant under his hand and seal at arms, directed to the Clerk of the faid Provincial Court of Appeals, shall from time to time, appoint, any thing in the above in part recited act contained, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Duty of the when the Governor shall have bolding the court of Appeals.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefaid, that when and so often as Clerk of the Court of Appeals the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or person administering the Government of this Province, for the time being, shall by such Warrant as aforesaid appoint any place fixed the place for as aforesaid, for the purpose aforesaid, it shall be the duty of the Clerk of the Provincial Court of Appeals, and he is hereby required forthwith to give public notice in the Onebec Gazette of the place wherein the Provincial Court of Appeals, under and by virtue of fuch Warrant, will be kept and holden.

Continuance of this Act.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall continue and be in force until the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fixteen.

CAP. XIX.

AN ACT to grant a certain sum of money to Joseph Bouchette, Esquire, to a sist him in publishing Geographical and Topographical Maps of the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada.
